Bartimaeus caused a stir. Normally he sat by the side of the road being a "good blind beggar." But one day Jesus passed nearby. Bartimaeus jumped up and called out to Jesus. We can imagine him turning toward the direction of the commotion and noise. Bartimaeus probably had his arms outstretched as he shouted out to the son of David.

The people who knew him were embarrassed by his outburst. They tried to hush him up and get him to sit back down by the roadside. Their actions spoke volumes: "Bartimaeus, you're not fit for Jesus." But it was okay for them and other "sighted" people to follow Jesus. In today's readings, we learn that true blindness is not a condition of our eyes but of our hearts.

From the Desk of the Administrator

As you may recall, October is the usual month for the year-end financial report. I would love to offer it. However, there has been a switch in the Diocesan accounting system. There won't be an official report until January. So, stay tuned.

In lieu of that report, let me share some financial numbers. Join in my recent headaches!

Let's talk windows. Beautiful, aren't they?

So, what has been raised to date? There are contributions of \$287,730.59. The sale of the convent added another \$34,264.82. *Our Campaign for the Church Alive! ©* will add \$70,000.00. All together the number is \$391,995.41. A job well done!

Now consider window expenses. We will have paid Renaissance Glassworks \$404,000.00. We have paid Safeway \$46,265.90 to date. There may still be something to Safeway. However, add those together and it's \$450,265.90.

Finally, let's balance the windows account. Take the expenses, subtract what we have raised, and it's a deficit of \$58,270.49 that has been paid from our savings. My hope is to recover some of that in another grant from Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation. I will be searching for other streams of revenue. The Parish will no longer accept windows donations as of 21 December 2015, so that they can process for 2015.

Another project upon us is the rectory roof. There have been some issues with the roof the last few years. Actually, there is no memory of when the current roof was installed.

Come spring, the rectory roof will be replaced. In so doing the dreaded word has been used – asbestos. Abatement will run \$19,573.00. The roof itself will cost \$44,150.00. This will be paid by savings, and perhaps some insurance money.

A third recent expenditure is "seen", literally, around the property. The electrician was here replacing bulbs and fixtures. It's great to have light around the property. I kept teasing him to be gentle with the billing! Stay tuned for the final cost of that necessary project.

Things are happening. Please keep up your support both personally and financially. Thanks!

Over the past several weeks, the students have been working diligently on posters and reports about the saints they have chosen. The pipe organ is the primary instrument used to accompany singing in Catholic and Christian worship. The *Constitution on Sacred Liturgy* says the organ "should be given pride of place in liturgical services." You may wonder how it came to be that the most sacred of instruments came to be so closely associated with Halloween and scary movies and television. Today, the organ is as likely to give rise to thoughts of vampires and ghosts as the worship of God. It did not start with *Dracula*, as even though Count Dracula is sometimes portrayed in films playing an organ, there is no mention of such in the original book. The most likely culprit is the novel, *The Phantom of the Opera*, where the character Erik the Phantom plays the organ under the opera house. This is carried over into the 1962 film version of *The Phantom*. There were other films as well, such as *Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* and *Fantasia*, which used organ in a spooky context. Bach's *Toccata and Fugue in D-Minor* is often featured in this way for its minor melodies and dissonant chords. There are probably many other reasons for the organ's association with Halloween – it was the instrument used to accompany films in the silent era, so that may factor in to the association as well. Hopefully, that sheds some light on why this instrument given "pride of place" in our liturgy is often shown in a very different light, especially at this time of the year.




