

Last Sunday I was part of some excitement in another parish in the Diocese. I was grateful to Fr. Lutz for covering the Sunday Masses while I was off doing a "Worship Gig". Our neighbors to the north, St. Alexis Parish, dedicated a new church building. I have to say, that of everything my office does, the Dedication of a Church and Altar is the most spectacular. I always say it's a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity! Congratulations to our neighbors!

Of course a new building makes me think about the impact of the *On Mission for the Church Alive!* Planning Process. Let me share some thoughts with you.

At the recent Clergy Convocation, Bishop Zubik announced some important dates. I wasn't there due to my medical test. However, it was announced that the final groupings, the clergy assignments, the number of Sunday Masses, and participation in track A, B, or C, will be announced on 25 April 2018. It will all take effect on 15 October 2018. So, we are starting to "land this airplane".






BOX

This week, we begin the month of November, a month set aside by the Church to remember all the faithful departed. It begins with two back to back feasts. On November 1st is our patron feast day, the Solemnity of All Saints, where we venerate those who have achieved their heavenly reward and we pray for their assistance to live our lives as they did, that we too may join them in heaven. Then, on November 2nd, we have the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed – commonly referred to as All Souls Day. On All Souls Day, we pray on behalf of all those who have died, especially the souls in purgatory, that they might quickly enter the kingdom of heaven. It is on this day that many parishes, including ours, celebrate a “Bereavement Mass” in which we remember all those of the parish who have passed in the last year. The Mass for All Souls Day has many of the same features, including readings and hymns, of the funeral Mass. Throughout the month of November, the Church prays with one voice: “Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and may perpetual light shine upon them.”

If you happen to be reading this prior to Sunday, members of our choir were privileged to once again sing at the WPXI-TV Mass for Shut-Ins that airs at 6AM on the 29th on PCNC and METv. We are honored to be able to again help with this valuable ministry to those in our diocese who cannot attend Mass.


