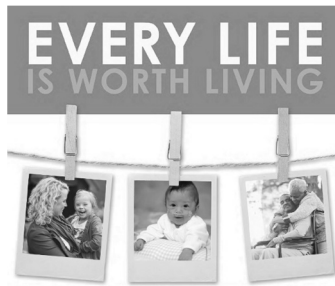

NOT MARRIED IN THE CHURCH?

There are many people attending Catholic parishes or in Catholic families whose marriage is somehow not fully recognized by the Church. Most of us know Catholics who have been married civilly but not yet in the Church. Sometimes there is a previous marriage, perhaps without an annulment, that is presenting a challenge to celebrating the sacrament.

Many of us also know Catholics who are cohabiting before marriage and have not yet taken the step to be married, civilly or through the Church. This half-day workshop is designed to help persons in those situations who are married by civil law or are cohabiting and who would like to seek the blessing of the Church on their union in the Sacrament of Marriage.

THE SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE, A BLESSING OR CONVALIDATION Often, Catholics who are married civilly have simply neglected to take the time to inquire about the process of bringing their marriage into the Church, celebrating the Sacrament of Marriage. We believe that the time taken for preparation and in the celebration of the sacrament is truly a blessing, and an opportunity to strength the bond of marriage. For those not married, an interview with Father or one of our deacons is a great way to begin. For those already in a civil marriage, the workshop will help with "next steps".



Ours is a dignity that is rooted in the fact that we were created in love and redeemed in love by God Himself, who is unchanging. Regardless of any circumstances, this God-given dignity can never be decreased.

Pope Francis also raised a challenging question that we each need to consider seriously: “In recognizing the inestimable value of human life, we must also reflect on how we use it. Life is first and foremost a gift.”

THE HUMAN AND THE DIVINE - MARRIAGE

Of all the events and circumstances that draw people together, it would seem that marriage is the most universal and obvious manifestation of that longing to be one. Though some may sacrifice marriage for what they deem to be a greater good or need, and others may never find their heart’s way to that dream, all of us long to be touched by the magic of committed love. There is something woven into the warp and woof of our lives that passionately searches for it. More than anything, it is the ideal of marital love that reveals what we are meant to be—all of life and love so united to one another that there is nothing to divide, since there is no longer anything but pure oneness. Then we are no longer two simply because we are one, one flesh.

That is what makes divorce such a sadness, such a personal and even communal tragedy—that it shatters the vision of what we are meant to be. That is also why it causes such pain, such a wrenching; for if marriage fails, might not then also God’s dream of who we shall be? That seems to be too unbearable even to dare consider.

Into such fragile human becoming, then, comes the Lord Jesus, among the married and the divorced, among the sad and the joyful, among the lost and the hopeful, into what we are no matter what we are. He is the most profound and transforming revelation of that unity to which we are called simply because he unites and embodies both the human and the divine in such a way that it can never again be alienated. —Rev. Joseph J. Juknialis

LO HUMANO Y LO DIVINO - MATRIMONIO

De entre todos los acontecimientos y todas las circunstancias que unen a las personas, el matrimonio parece ser la manifestación más universal y obvia de ese anhelo de ser uno con otra persona. Aunque algunos sacrifican el matrimonio por lo que ellos estiman ser un bien o una necesidad mayor, y otros puede que nunca encuentren ese sueño de su corazón, todos anhelamos la magia de un amor comprometido. Hay algo en lo más recóndito de lo que compone la latitud y longitud de nuestro ser que busca ese amor apasionadamente. La idea del amor marital es lo que revela más que ninguna otra cosa aquello para lo cual hemos sido creados: toda la vida y todo el amor tan unidos en los unos por los otros, que no hay nada que dividir, pues ya no existe otra cosa que una sola unidad. Entonces ya no somos dos debido sencillamente a que somos uno, una sola carne.

Eso es lo que hace que el divorcio sea tan triste, una tragedia personal y comunitaria que destruye la visión de aquello para lo cual hemos sido creados. Es por eso también que causa tanto dolor, tanto traumatismo, pues si el matrimonio falla, ¿no tendrá la misma suerte el sueño de Dios sobre lo que debemos ser? Eso parece ser demasiado inaguantable ni aun para atrevernos a considerarlo.

A tal fragilidad humana viene el Señor Jesús, a vivir entre los casados y divorciados, entre los tristes y los alegres, entre los perdidos y los esperanzados, viene a entrar en lo que somos, sin importar lo que somos. Él es la revelación más profunda y transformadora de esa unidad a la que estamos llamados sencillamente porque él une y encarna lo humano y lo divino de tal manera que nunca más pueden distanciarse.

Saint Bruno - c. 1030-1101 - Feast day—October 6

Bruno was born to nobility in Cologne, Germany. After studies in France, he was ordained a priest and in about 1056 began a 20-year stint teaching theology at Reims, France. But when Bruno denounced the archbishop for simony, he was forced to leave. With six companions, he withdrew to Chartreuse, France, to found the Carthusian order combining solitary and communal living. In 1090, Pope Urban II summoned him to Rome as an adviser, but Bruno was unhappy away from his order. He was allowed to start another charterhouse in Calabria, Italy, where he later died.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR CHILDREN

What is RCIA for children?

The RCIA for children is a process that invites children, ages 7 to 14, interested in searching the Catholic Faith to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to unbaptized children, children baptized in another faith, and children who may be baptized but who have not practiced their Catholic faith regularly. Like the RCIA for adults this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment, but especially designed for children. Separate sessions of Catechesis (education) are presented in dialog format. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church and are combined with the Adults at the same Mass.

San Bruno - c. 1030-1101 - Festividad—6 de octubre

Bruno nació en Colonia, Alemania y era de origen noble. Luego de estudiar en Francia, fue ordenado sacerdote y, alrededor del año 1056, empezó a enseñar teología en Reims, Francia, lo cual hizo por 20 años. Pero cuando Bruno denunció al arzobispo por simonía, se vio forzado a alejarse de allí. Junto con seis compañeros, él se retiró a Chartreuse, Francia, para fundar la orden de los Cartujos, combinando una vida solitaria y en comunidad. En 1090, el papa Urbano II le pide que vaya a Roma para que sea su consejero pero Bruno no era feliz alejado de su orden y se le permitió empezar una cartuja en Calabria, Italia, donde años más tarde falleció.

GOD'S LOVE OF FAMILY

With the visit of Pope Francis in Philadelphia for the World Meeting of Families just a short time ago, and the emphasis he has been placing on the importance of our awareness of the larger family of God, the readings today help us to recall the roots and mission of family. As the pinnacle of God's creative work, man and woman are given a unique gift of being bonded to one another in love. Human creatures are not meant to live in isolation, but are called to be caretakers of creation.

The Hebrew word "adam" means the human race; it also signifies a single living person. The link between the story of creation and the statement of Jesus in today's Gospel clearly affirms the Creator's intent in forming and nurturing the human family. This also forms part of the basis of the Church's teaching on the importance of the family.

These readings lead us to reflection on the relationship between God and human beings. The gospel particularly heralds the relationship between husband and wife, and the special welcome Jesus gives to the young children. Each day we have both the opportunity and the responsibility to grow in faith and holy relationship with those around us. A powerful message from the Scriptures is that the disciples of Jesus are called to holiness every day – doing the best we can each day all for the greater honor and glory of God! The image of marriage as a bond prefigures the relationship between Jesus and believers. In our Church treasury of prayers and feasts, we also honor the saints who are models for us in our relationship with the divine and with one another.

This month we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This is a good time to use booklets or resources on-line to learn about the Rosary, to make a real effort to pray the rosary – especially with your family members. There is a website www.newadvent.org which has a helpful guide to praying the rosary. In the weeks ahead we will be learning more about all these in our Adult Faith – RCIA/RICA – sessions. Blessed Mother Mary and the saints give us models on living holy lives every day. May we be inspired by them and graced by God!

If we think deeply about it, our blessings are a combination of God's grace and our work – gifts and opportunities that have come to us. Our thankfulness is part of our daily prayer, honoring God for God's goodness and faithfulness.

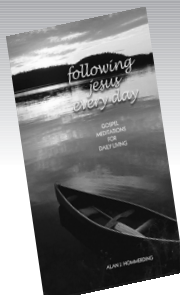
