KATERI TEKAKWITHA - 1656-1680

Feast Day - July 14



The daughter of a Mohawk chief and an Algonquin woman, Kateri was orphaned in a smallpox epidemic that left her partly blind and disfigured. She was baptized by a French missionary visiting her village in present-day New York State. But, her faith and refusal to marry caused trouble, and she fled to an Indian community near Montreal, where she was revered by French and Indians alike for her mystical gifts and kindness. At her canonization in 2012, Pope Benedict XVI prayed, "Saint Kateri, Protectress of Canada and the first native American saint, we entrust to you the renewal of the faith in the first nations and in all of North America! May God bless the first nations!" The "Lily of the Mohawk" is the patron of Native Americans, refugees, and the disabled.

KATERI TEKAKWITHA - 1656-1680 - Festividad - 14 de julio

Kateri, hija de un jefe Mohawk y de una mujer algonquina, se quedó huérfana durante una epidemia de viruela que la dejó parcialmente ciega y desfigurada. Ella fue bautizada por un misionero francés que visitaba su pueblo en el actual estado de Nueva York. Pero su fe y su negativa a casarse le causo algunos problemas y huyó a una comunidad nativa cerca a Montreal, en donde fue venerada por los franceses y los indios por igual por sus dones místicos y su bondad. En el 2012, durante su canonización, el papa Benedicto XVI oró: "Santa Kateri, protectora de Canadá y primera santa amerindia, te confiamos la renovación de la fe en los pueblos originarios y en toda América del Norte". El "lirio de los Mohawk" es la patrona de los nativo-americanos, los refugiados y los discapacitados.

Even being outdoors for short periods of time in high temperatures can cause serious health problems. Monitor your activities and time in the sun to lower your risk for heat-related illness.

- ◆ If you're outside in hot weather for most of the day, drink more fluids.
- ◆ Avoid drinking liquids that contain alcohol or large amounts of sugar especially in the heat.
- ◆ Take breaks from activities often. Try to rest in shaded areas so that your body's thermostat has a chance to recover. Stop working if you experience breathlessness, muscle soreness or chest pains.
- ◆ Be alert to signs of heat-related illness, including extremely high body temperature, headache, rapid pulse, dizziness, nausea, confusion, or unconsciousness.
- ◆ Monitor those who are at higher risk for heat-related illnesses, including infants and children up to four years of age; people 65 years of age or older; people who are overweight; those who push themselves too hard during work or exercise.
- ◆ Eat healthy foods to remain energized.

FACT OF FAITH DOCTORS OF THE CHURCH?

Is there a doctor in the house? Well, if that house is the Church, then the answer is "yes." And we don't mean medical doctors. Of all the various kinds of saints in the church — virgins, martyrs, religious, whatever — the least appreciated by most people may be the Doctors of the Church.

These saints are probably best thought of as doctors in the PhD sense of the word. Through their research, study, and writing, they have advanced the Church's knowledge of our faith. To be declared a Doctor of the Church does not imply that all their writings are free from error but rather that the whole body of their work, taken together serves to advance the cause of Christ and his Church.

The title was first given in the Middle Ages, and originally, there were four great Doctors of the Church: St. Ambrose, 4th century bishop of Milan, St. Augustine, 5th century bishop of Hippo, St. Gregory the Great, who was pope at the start of the 7th century, and St. Jerome, the 5th century biblical scholar and translator. Over the years the church has added about 30 additional saints with the title "Doctor of the Church," including St. Bonaventure, whose feast day is celebrated on July 15. Since 1970, four women have also been declared "Doctors of the Church": St. Teresa of Avila; St. Catherine of Siena; St. Thérèse of Lisieux, who received the title in 1998; and St. Hildegard of Bingen, who was declared a Doctor of the Church in 2012 by Pope Benedict XVI. Most recently, in February 2015, Pope Francis declared Armenian poet and monk St. Gregory of Narek a Doctor of the Universal Church.

All these Doctors of the Church advanced the knowledge of God through their writing on theology, spirituality, mysticism, or through their defense of the faith in the face of heresy and schism.

15th SUNDAY
IN ORDINARY TIME
CALLED, FORMED AND SENT

Get ready! We are at the time when Mark's Gospel brings us to a key theme – how Jesus guides and nourishes his disciples to become apostles – those sent out to proclaim the Good News. Today's readings all focus on the wondrous and challenging call of God to us -- not only follow Jesus, but in fact, to listen so attentively to his Word that we become prophets (like Amos) and apostles (like Paul and the apostles in the Gospel).

Amos, a shepherd, was called from his flock to prophesy to the people of Israel – to call them back to faithfulness to the Covenant with their God. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians affirms that Jesus forms and guides the chosen ones. In the Gospel selection from Mark we hear the story of how the Twelve, the apostles, are sent out to preach, to drive out demons and to heal the sick. Yet, both Amos and the apostles would confront resistance and being unwelcome. Like them, we are not always going to find it easy to live out our faith, to witness to our Catholic Christian beliefs.

In Paul's letter to the Ephesians we are also assured that when God chooses persons to carry out his purposes, those chosen are strengthened for the mission. This message from Paul seems to be intimately tied to baptism, to being chosen, blessed, sealed with the Holy Spirit – he speaks of the followers of Christ Jesus, reminding them – and us – that we have been chosen, blessed, strengthened and redeemed. We don't usually think of ourselves as missionaries – yet, that is our calling: to be witnesses and apostles of Jesus Christ each and every day.

Remember that God speaks to us in many ways – through the Word and Eucharist, through our work and the everyday experiences of our lives -- and sends us off to be apostles! We are reminded of the importance of listening to God. There is within each of us that call – to know that we are loved by God, and to live in such a way that our very lives are a witness of our faith and relationship with God. May we celebrate each day that grace of faith which helps shape our lives. God be with you and bless you!
