Dear parishioners and friends

THE DAYS WE LIVE FOR

Just why do we do the things that we do during holy week? Why are the services so long? What does it all mean?

As we prepare to celebrate the Triduum, the 3 holiest days of the year for Catholic Christians (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday-The Easter Vigil) why not come out on Monday March 19, at 7:00 pm for an interesting and informative session with guest presenter, Msgr. Rich LaVerghetta. Fr. Andy's classmate is a pastor of a megachurch in the Diocese of Trenton, NJ., and is a former adjunct professor of homiletics at Seton Hall University. His very bright, energetic and witty demeanor will help us to delve more deeply into what these three days are all about, thus enhancing our celebration of Easter. Bring a friend. All are welcome!

ATTENTION ALL LITURGICAL MINISTERS

You will notice that assignments for the Sacred Triduum as well as for Easter have purposely been left off of your recent schedules. All ministers for these liturgies will be called individually and they will be posted in the bulletin on Palm Sunday weekend. For some, you will be asked to attend a special practice as we will be doing things a bit differently this year. All Eucharistic ministers are asked to be in attendance for the Holy Thursday celebration and to walk in procession. Also I'd ask that all liturgical ministers plan to attend the <u>one hour Adult Faith</u> Formation workshop being given on March 19.

THE CROSS IN THE SANCTUARY

One cannot help but marvel at the dramatic cross which lays against the sacrificial table of our Lord, called the altar, in our sanctuary. There is absolutely nothing beautiful about the cross of Jesus Christ and so it is fitting that the cross made for our church was made from very rustic pieces of wood which began as a seedling for a hemlock tree in the mid-1700s. The tree continued to grow near Aldenville, Pa. until it was cut down about 100 years later and became part of the rear frame of a new building housing the Aldenville Baptist Church. Those beams which were once a tree, saw so much history, then witnessed and listened to hymns, sermons, Bible readings, marriage vows, funeral eulogies, and professions of faith resulting in the waters of baptism. If only that cross in our sanctuary could talk. However, for all of us who gather here this Lent, it speaks of a much greater reality. It speaks of God's ultimate act of love for humankind. It speaks of the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! This cross which will be used on Good Friday and venerated by the faithful was gifted to our church by **Dan** Droppa of "Aldenville Log and Lumber." When I asked some parishioners to find a large wooden cross for us to use in our sanctuary during Lent, little did I know that they would bring back such a piece of history which was made especially for our church. As this cross plays such an integral part of our Lent as a parish this year, we pray for Mr. Droppa, we are connected to our brothers and sisters of other Christian faiths, and we find in this dramatic symbol a reminder of Jesus' passion, death and above all else, the Father's great love for each and every one of us!
