WITH MUCH GRATITUDE

As I have announced in the past, there is a need for many improvement's regarding liturgical vessels and appointments. Also, as it is with any home, our physical plant continues to need attention. In the past few months, donations have been received which have helped us to purchase a new sprinkling bucket, censor, and incense stand. The Roman Missal with the prayers for mass and the new Book of the Gospels have been purchased. We have added a new piano to our sanctuary. We have a new chapel for private adoration and confession. These are but a few improvements which will be noted in a new engraved "BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE" still to be designed. Your generosity makes all of this possible and is very much appreciated. Thank you and God bless you.

FURTHER IMPROVEMENTS

It has been noted that many of our vessels, ciboria and chalices, used to hold our Eucharistic bread and the blood of Christ at mass, have become worn and pitted and have been in need of replacing. Many of these vessels are beautiful but quite costly and have been donated by individuals whose families are still alive in our congregation. While the purchase of more inexpensive vessels is a possibility, out of deference to the families who have donated these vessels and because of their value, I have decided to repair and to restore the ones that we already have. Either way it is a costly endeavor as it involves six particular vessels in need of gold or silver re-plating at the cost of \$650.00 each. Some have been completed and are being used this weekend at our Pentecost masses. Anyone wishing to assist in this regard, is asked to please contact the parish office. All of these vessels are used regularly in our daily, weekly, funeral and marriage liturgies, as well as at special events. Those donating toward this restoration will be acknowledged in a "Book of Remembrance" which is in its development stage.
