

#### The Risen Lord



One of the features of the stories about the appearances of Jesus after his Resurrection is that they nearly always end up with Jesus commissioning someone. Jesus appears for a purpose. The presence of Jesus is strongly linked with the sense of calling. Peter denied Jesus three times on the night of Jesus' arrest and now Jesus is offering him

three chances to redeem himself. Jesus first dealt with Peter's sin, and then commissioned him to work on His behalf. He asks twice if Peter loves him with the deeper, stronger, and more sacrificial kind of love and not mere brotherly love or friendship. In any event, "the one thing about which Jesus questioned Peter prior to commissioning him to tend the flock, was love. This is the basic qualification for Christian service. Other qualities may be desirable, but love is completely indispensable (cf. 1 Cor. 13:1-3)." Let us compensate for our moments of weakness

by genuine acts of love, compassion and service. Peter was called upon to prove his love: "If you love me, feed my sheep." The same Risen Lord reminds us: "If you love Me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). What do our present actions and activities say about our love for Christ? The Risen Jesus accepts our apology, dismisses the charges against us, exonerates us of guilt, and forgives all our weaknesses. He continues to challenge us to demonstrate our love for him by faithfully feeding his sheep entrusted to our care. (http://en.radiovaticana.va)

#### Year of Mercy Parish Pilgrimage

Each person is asked to think about and pray about the following questions:

- ➤ How important is Sacred Heart Parish in my life?
- ➤ How much do I care about my parish community?

- ➤ How proportionate is my financial support to Sacred Heart Parish compared to other ways I use money? (If you give monthly or annually, calculate your weekly amount for the comparison)
- Do I give too much, just enough or too little?
- Do I really stop, at least once a year, and consider my weekly giving? Do I have talents and skills that my community can use in addition to my weekly giving?

These questions will help everyone to truly consider what priority they place on their connection to their parish community. During the next two weeks please pray about these and other similar questions that probe the depth of your care for Sacred Heart Parish.
