<u>Second Sunday of Easter – Divine Mercy Sunday</u>

This Sunday is the feast of Divine Mercy. In our deanery, Divine Mercy Sunday Services will be held this afternoon at St. Mary's Church in Eynon. Confessions will be held from 1:30 to 3:00 with chaplet and Benediction following.

Jesus said to St. Faustina in the 1930's "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699)

Plenary Indulgence: In a decree dated August 3, 2002, the



Apostolic Penitentiary nounced that in order "to ensure that the faithful would observe this day (Divine Mercy Sunday) with intense devotion, the Supreme Pontiff himself established that this Sunday be enriched by a plenary indulgence...so that the faithful might receive in great abundance the gift of the consolation of the Holy Spirit. In this way, they can foster a growing love for God and for their neighbor, and after they have obtained God's pardon, they in turn might be persuaded to show a prompt pardon to their brothers

and sisters." The plenary indulgence is granted (under the usual conditions of a sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and a prayer for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on Divine Mercy Sunday, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, recite the Our Father and the Creed, and also adding a devout prayer (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!). It is the Father's will that we should recognize Christ our brother in the persons of all men and love them with an effective love, in word and in deed (Pastoral Constitution, Gaudium et spes, n. 93).

Bishop Bambera's Pastoral Vision states: "Parish social ministry responds to human needs, whatever and wherever they may be, whether with parishioners or other members of the community, whether the need be hunger, housing, illness, loneliness, employment, fair wages, physical disabilities or ecological sustainability... Parish social ministry must respond to issues of respect for human life at every stage of existence.... However it is done, parish social ministry needs to be organized and deliberate. It must be communal, planned and directed by a group, and not a simple individual response." To this end, the Diocesan Office for Social Concerns is facilitating regional conferences, gathering neighboring parishes in order to help us create or build up parish social ministries.
