

"Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." Here, in a nutshell, is the Christian belief about the afterlife. We trust that heaven is open to believers who accept the gift of salvation and follow the way of the Lord, even (or especially) when that way is difficult!


The beatitudes in today's Gospel give us a program for following the path to heaven. These famous words offer a kind of twofold image. There are, on the one hand, the beatitudes about what we should do and be: poor in spirit, meek, merciful, clean of heart, and peacemakers. Such qualities are reflections of the nature of God in whose image we are meant to live. When we embrace and reflect this image to the world, there is no doubt we are walking on the path of God's will.

Then, there are also the beatitudes about what we are called to endure: mourning, hunger for righteousness, persecutions and insults resulting from our belief in Jesus. These are the trials that often beset the life of a faithful Christian-admittedly more so in some ages and areas than in others. But Jesus makes it clear that even these trials and struggles are a sign that a Christian is on the right path, not that God has abandoned him or her, but that the reward of heaven lies around the corner.

One of the greatest consolations of our faith is that even

when life does not unfold according to our own perfect designs, even when there is suffering to deal with, even when we do not have great success in the eyes of the world, we can maintain hope and peace as we await the "reward" of the just. The eternal happiness of heaven will be worth every ounce of temporary trial here on earth.


Additional Donors to the Diocesan Annual Appeal

Pro-Life Action Alert!

Sunday, January 22, 2017, marked the 44th anniversary of the deadly *Roe v*. *Wade* decision. Yet, even while we mourn the lives lost and hearts broken by legal

abortion we can recommit ourselves to building a culture of life where everyone is welcomed in love and protected in law. *We must, and together we will continue to advocate for public policy that protects life and liberty.*

On Monday, January 23, 2017, President Trump has taken the first step towards seeing that *none of your tax money* pays for abortion. With the stroke of a pen, President Trump restored the Mexico City Policy by executive order. The Executive Memorandum to reinstate the Mexico City Policy stops taxpayer funding of groups that perform and promote abortions *overseas*. It does not stop, however, nonabortion international assistance. The order ensures U.S. foreign aid will continue to go to health care and humanitarian relief in the millions of dollars.

On Tuesday, Jan. 24, U.S. House of Representatives voted 238 to 183 to permanently ban taxpayer funding of abortion in America, supporting the No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act (H.R. 7). This important pro-life legislation will make the protections of the consistent federal policy known as the Hyde Amendment and other current abortion funding prohibitions permanently part of the law to be enforced government-wide. It will even ensure that the Affordable Care Act (ACA) does not force taxpayers to fund abortion. There is a long-standing consensus in our nation even among those who identify themselves as "pro-choice"-that taxpavers should not be coerced into paying for abortions. Since 1976 this policy has enjoyed bipartisan support and has been embodied in the Hyde Amendment and other policies regarding funding. However, there are inconsistencies in its application and most of these policies including the Hyde Amendment must be renewed every year. H.R. 7 will correct these inadequacies.

Right Now, Your Help is Needed ... and here is one quick February 201 step we can take. Urge our PA Senators to support H.R. 7 to permanently protect our tax dollars from paying for or promoting elective abortions. It's unclear when exactly the Senate will vote on HR 7, so when it comes to calling our Senators, time is of the essence. Dial 202-224-3121 and follow the simple prompts. Encourage Senators Bob Casey and Pat Toomey to vote YES on H.R. 7 in order to promote a culture of life that includes all human lives including and especially the lives of the defenseless unborn.
