12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus' identity, as far as his mission is concerned, leads to the identity of his disciples, and not only of the Twelve, but of "anyone who wishes to come after him" (Luke 9:23). In fact, following Jesus implies identifying with him and with the values and tenets of the Kingdom of God, where power means service and leadership involves becoming the servant of the rest. Jesus' kingship is exerted from the throne of the cross. That is what the Songs of the Suffering Servant (we read them in Holy Week) announced and what today's text from Zechariah anticipated symbolically. From the perspective of baptism when we die to the old human condition, Christians enter a new realm where differences that are the rule in this world cease to have any relevance. We are all "one in Christ." Race, position and even gender do not matter anymore. Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being.
