## 6th Sunday of Easter



Today we celebrate the 6th Sunday of Easter. Thursday we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension and then we close the Easter season with the celebration of Pentecost. In our Gospel today we read from what is referred to as Jesus'

farewell discourse. In movies the farewell scene is often the time when the hero or heroine says something especially important and moving. I suspect they got this idea from Jesus' farewell discourse. In this Gospel Jesus reminds us of four important things. 1. "Whoever loves me will keep my word." 2. He will send "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit" to "teach you everything and to remind you of all that I told you." 3. Peace is Jesus' farewell gift to his disciples "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world give do I give it to you." 4. He has told us this "before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe." These words are important and they remind

us that even though Jesus is not physically present with us, he is still with us nonetheless. And because of the gift of the Holy Spirit we are enabled and empowered to live as his disciples. (Thoughts on the Readings by Fr. Bauer, www.Mary.org)
