Fourth Sunday of Easter



"Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture." Jesus uses the image of a gate today to help us understand how we are to relate to him. He is our path to "pasture," in other words, to

the peace and prosperity that we long for. He shows us the way to find all that we need right there before us.

Some people, however, may think that it's better to avoid the trouble of finding the gate and thus choose to enter another way instead. But Jesus says, "Whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate, but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber." Although this is all cast in the gentle terms of an analogy about sheep, the message is actually rather stern. Jesus is telling us that if we don't follow him, we are taking the wrong course of action. He is not suggesting a kind of relativistic principle that says, "Following me is one of many good options." No. He is telling us that in order to "have life and have it more abundantly," we must be willing to follow his way. This isn't always the easiest path to follow. It might mean taking the long way around a situation instead of a shortcut. It might mean waiting a little while to get to that pasture instead of hopping the fence and finding it on our own terms. Insisting on using the gate may also make us look like fools to those around us. But to be truly faithful followers of Jesus, we need to trust that his way is the best way. We need to trust that, by letting him lead, we will ultimately end up in the best possible pasture.

In our culture, it is becoming less and less popular to believe in one true religion, but as Christians we know that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. This we believe and profess.



Next Saturday, May 13th, is the Feast of our Lady of Fatima. The closeness of Our Lady to us and her call to return to the Gospel through prayer, sacrifice, and conversion are as important for us today as they were in 1917. America Needs Fatima, an organization dedicated to promulgating the message of our Lady at Fatima has spearheaded a national rosary rally effort and invited the faithful to hold public rosary rallies on May 13th for the 100th Anniversary of the first apparition of Our Lady of Fatima. To date, over 4,000 rosary rallies will be held at 12 noon with the goal of gathering the faithful to prayer to usher in the Triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. All are invited to attend a local rally to pay honor to Mary on this momentous Centennial year. The itinerary for the rally includes Marian hymns and prayers: St. Thomas Aquinas Church, Archbald, at the statue of Our Lady of Vilna. St. Rose of Lima Church, Carbondale, at Our Lady of Lourdes Grotto (rosary balloon release immediately following). We pray that these rallies, plus thousands of others across the nation, will bring public awareness of our need for God in America and the role of Our Lady as intercessor and mother of mankind.
