Question of the week: What is the meaning of the Advent Wreath? The Advent candles readily demonstrate the strong contrast between darkness and light. In the Bible, Christ is referred to as the "Light of the World" contrasted with the darkness of sin. As his Advent, or "Coming" draws nearer, another candle is lit, with each candle dispelling the darkness a little more. Thus, the Advent wreath helps us to spiritually contemplate the great drama of salvation history that surrounds the birth of God incarnate who comes to redeem the human race. The circular shape of the wreath, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us- a love that sent his Son into the world to redeem us from the curse of sin. It also represents eternal life which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.
