Question of the Week – Why do Priests wear different colors and what do those colors signify:

*White/Gold- symbolizes rejoicing and purity of soul. This color is worn during the liturgical seasons of Christmas and Easter.

*Red has a dual imagery: on one hand it symbolizes the shedding of blood, and therefore is used on Palm Sunday, Good Friday, the Lord's Passion, and the feasts of other martyrs who offered their lives for their faith. Red also signifies the burning fire of God's Love, so this color is also worn on Pentecost Sunday, and for the Votive Masses of the Holy Spirit.

*Green is used during the liturgical season called Ordinary Time. It runs from June-November. This season focuses on the three-year period of our Lord's public ministry and the Gospel passages, particularly on Sundays. During this season we recount His teachings, miracles, exorcisms, and other deeds at this time.

<u>Violet/Purple</u> is used during Advent and Lent as a sign of penance, sacrifice, and preparation. At the midpoint of both of these seasons rose vestments are worn as a sign of joy. We rejoice at the midpoint because we are half-way through the preparation, and anticipate the coming joy of Christmas or Easter.

<u>Black-</u> although not seen very frequently in the United States today, black vestments may be worn for Masses of Christian Burial as a sign of death and mourning. Black may also be used on the Feast of All Souls or for any Mass of the Dead, such as on the anniversary of the death of a loved one.
