

### Question of the Week - How can we and our children get more out of Mass?

The Lord's Prayer: Now we join together as a community to pray the prayer that Jesus taught us. Engage: Focus on a particular word or phrase and allow it to permeate your whole being. If you are struggling to cooperate with God's will, perhaps you will focus on "thy will be done". Or maybe you have real, human needs that are not being met, so your focus may fall on the words "Give us this day our daily bread." Perhaps you feel the need to be forgiven for something you have said or done, so you concentrate on the words "forgive us our trespasses." Maybe you need the grace to forgive someone else who has wronged you, and you hear the words "As we forgive those who trespass against us." Or perhaps you are struggling with a particular temptation at this time in your life, so the words "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" are the ones that you focus on.
