

### Question of the Week -. What do the different "levels" of candles mean?

The main function of the Votive Candles (displayed in glass containers in racks or stands) is to maintain the intention of prayers, usually for a specific purpose or issue. Those who light them usually say a prayer over one candle at a time, and by keeping these individual candles lit, the specific prayer is believed to be prolonged and amplified along with the intentions of other believers' prayers. Even when churchgoers leave, their prayers remain in the church, and then others may pray over the candles later. The small votive candles burn for about 6 hours, and the larger ones burn for 6 days. Catholics also use votive candles as to remember their deceased loved ones, usually on All Saints Day and All Souls Day.
