Notes from our Parish Nurse... DID YOU KNOW?

Most sunscreen actually expires after 3 years! Sunscreen that has been exposed to heat for an

extended period of time may have a shorter shelf life. Check the expiration date before using. You might be applying ineffective sunscreen!

- Use sunscreen with at least 15 SPF. The higher the SPF, the more protection from the sun it provides.
- Sunscreen also wears off easily so make sure to reapply every 2 hours in the sun or after being in the water, sweating, or drying off with a towel.
- Try wearing wraparound sun glasses to protect your eyes and the sensitive skin around your eyes from the suns harsh UV rays. This will help lower the risk of cataracts!
- Remember to protect your skin even on cloudy days. UV rays can still reach your skin!
