Jubilee Year of Mercy

Last Sunday, Jesus rebuked James and John for wanting to “call down fire from heaven” (Luke 9:54–55) on an unwelcoming town. As he sends forth disciples today, Jesus again forbids retaliation against non-receptive listeners (10:10–11), showing us how to be Jesus’ “missionaries of mercy” this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*. Like the first disciples, we are sent not to proclaim ourselves but Jesus. As Jesus sent them in pairs, so are we also to work together in the community of the Church. We often describe the Church as Isaiah describes Jerusalem in today’s first reading, our comforting, nurturing Mother (Isaiah 66:13). So, going forth gently, like lambs among wolves (Luke 10:3), we share comforting peace, nurturing food and drink (Luke’s image for Eucharist), and Jesus’ healing promise of unfailing, unconditional mercy (10:5, 7, 9). Thus Jesus bids us proclaim the kingdom of God by showing what God’s kingdom looks like in action. “Go, preach the Gospel,” Pope Francis’ saintly namesake of Assisi is said to have instructed his first friars, “and when necessary, use words!” —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. PEACE

The greeting of peace at Mass adds substance to a message of today’s readings: peace is relational. When we greet in peace the person near us at Mass, we share the touch of a handshake or embrace, sincere eye contact, and friendly words.

The scriptures speak of a similar peace. The first reading from Isaiah describes the peace of the holy city, Jerusalem, a place of prosperity and comfort where the “LORD’s power shall be known to his servants” (Isaiah 66:14c).

The Christian understanding of peace changes slightly. Paul writes of the “peace and mercy” on all who are created anew. Jesus describes a feeling of peace that will rest on those who accept his disciples and their message.

Peace is both an absence of strife and a personal blessing. May we always and sincerely bring peace to our own lives as we share it with others.

Año Jubilar de la Misericordia

El domingo pasado, Jesús reprendió a James y John por querer "hacer bajar fuego del cielo" (Lucas 9: 54-55) en un pueblo hospitalario. Como es enviada por él discípulos de hoy, Jesús otra vez prohíbe represalias en contra de los oyentes no receptivos (10: 10-11), que nos muestra cómo ser "misioneros de la misericordia" de Jesús este año jubilar de la Merced. Como los primeros discípulos, no hemos sido enviados a anunciarnos a nosotros mismos, sino a Jesús. Como Jesús los envió de dos en dos, también lo son también para trabajar juntos en la comunidad de la Iglesia. A menudo describimos la Iglesia como Isaías describe Jerusalén en la primera lectura de hoy, nuestro consuelo, la crianza de la madre (Isaías 66:13). Así, saliendo suavemente, como corderos en medio de lobos (Lucas 10: 3), compartimos la paz reconfortante, comida crianza y la bebida (la imagen de Lucas para la Eucaristía), y la promesa de curación de Jesús de la misericordia inagotable e incondicional (10: 5, 7, 9). Así, Jesús nos invita a anunciar el Reino de Dios mostrando lo que el reino de Dios se parece en acción. "Id, predicad el Evangelio," Papa Francisco con el nombre del santo de Asís se dice haber dado instrucciones a sus primeros frailes ", y cuando es necesario, usa alabras!" —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. PAZ

El saludo de la paz en la misa añade sustancia a un mensaje de las lecturas de hoy: la paz es relacional. Cuando nos saludamos en paz con la persona cerca de nosotros en la misa, compartimos el toque de un apretón de manos o abrazos, el contacto visual sincero y palabras amistosas. Las escrituras hablan de una paz similar. La primera lectura de Isaías describe la paz de la ciudad santa, Jerusalén, un lugar de prosperidad y confort, donde el "poder de Jehová será conocido de sus servidores" (Isaías 66: 14C).

La comprensión cristiana de la paz cambia ligeramente. Pablo escribe de la "paz y la misericordia" sobre todos los que son creados de nuevo. Jesús describe una sensación de paz que descansará sobre los que aceptan ser sus discípulos y su mensaje. La paz es tanto una ausencia de contienda y bendición personal.
