



The Cross of Forgiveness

Why should we forgive those who hurt us? The gospel this Sunday gives three reasons: First, because Jesus commands it. Second, because forgiveness is part of loving one another. And third, because we want to be forgiven for our sins.

Obviously, Jesus expects us to forgive one another. Here he commands us to forgive unceasingly, without limit. Now that could be a challenge for even the most patient person. So does forgiveness exclude tough love? Does it mean we have to let someone hurt us over and over? No, it is possible to forgive someone and also prevent them from hurting us, if we do it with love (the second reason.) For instance, we might forgive an alcoholic family member, but still insist that they get help. We can forgive a son or daughter who breaks the law, but still let them face the consequences so they learn from their mistake. We may forgive a friend who borrows money without repaying it, but still refer them to a credit counselor, instead of lending them more money. Since forgiveness is part of love, it is also part of tough love.

That leads to the third reason: We forgive because we want to be forgiven. Or more accurately, we forgive because we have been forgiven. Jesus has already died for our sins. His resurrection shows us that the Father accepted the sacrifice of his Son Jesus for our sins. If we truly believe that Jesus is risen and that we will rise to eternal life with him in spite of our sins, how can we refuse to forgive someone who hurts us? When we promise to take up our cross each day to follow Jesus, we must remember why Jesus took up his cross and realize that we have to forgive as he does. That is why the cross is such a powerful symbol. It challenges us to accept suffering for Jesus' sake. It reminds us that sometimes our cross is simply forgiving someone rather than hurting them back or hating them. 

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¿Por qué celebramos Domingo Catequético?

En 1935, el Vaticano publicó en, On the Better Care and Promotion of Cathechetical Education, un documento que pide a todos los países reconocer la importancia del ministerio de la enseñanza de la Iglesia en honor a los que sirven a la comunidad cristiana como catequistas. SER PERDONADO Y PERDONAR

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús llama a sus seguidores a perdonar "setenta veces siete". En otras palabras, dejar de contar las veces que perdonamos a los demás. Pero cuando nos lastiman, es muy difícil de hacerlo. De hecho, para protegernos nosotros de más daño, podríamos estar inclinados a hacer lo opuesto y arremeter. Jesús nos enseña la inutilidad de esta propuesta.

La parábola del siervo impecable nos recuerda que en el curso de nuestras vidas hemos lastimado a los demás, y distanciado de Dios. También hemos sido lastimados por otros. Como el siervo, algunas veces tenemos deudas y algunas veces otros tiene alguna deuda con nosotros. Aquí se nos invita a detener el ciclo del dolor con la gracia de la misericordia. Se nos llama a imitar a nuestro Dios, quien perdona con todo el corazón.

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PROTEGIENDO A LOS VULNERABLES

Es muy tentador ver esta enseñanza del perdón de manera aislada. Esto sugeriría que la carga se pone completamente en la persona ofendida que necesita perdón, sin mencionar la responsabilidad de la parte de la persona que ofendió. Esta interpretación puede ser peligrosa. La llamada a perdonar nunca debe ser usada para cubrir el acoso o cualquier tipo de relación opresiva.

Es de bastante ayuda considerar el capítulo 18 del Evangelio de Mateo, el cual nos enseña acerca del perdón y la reconciliación, y el ejercicio de la autoridad en la comunidad cristiana. El Evangelio de la semana pasada (Mateo 18:15-18) provee guía en cómo los cristianos pueden llamar a la rendición de cuentas a alguien que lastimó a otros, como el patrón que protege al segundo siervo de la crueldad del siervo impecable, Dios busca proteger a los más vulnerables de ser lastimados.

El Evangelio de Mateo presentó una alternativa basada en la violencia de su tiempo. Mateo describe la visión de la comunidad de Jesús, en el que el poder es usado al servicio de todos y los vulnerables son protegidos y amados.
