HOLY HOUR ON TUESDAY NIGHT:

A number of people have asked about the structure of the Tuesday night Holy Hour. Allow me the opportunity to explain: At 6:00 P.M., I place the Eucharist in the Monstrance (called Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament). After a few moments of quiet prayer, I read a Gospel passage and give a brief reflection. Following the reflection, I hear confessions until about 6:45pm. During that time, people sit/kneel in quiet prayer before our Lord, present to us in the Eucharist (called Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament). Some pray the rosary, read from the bible or other spiritual books. At 6:45 P.M., we begin Solemn Benediction in which those present are blessed as the priest makes the sign of the cross with the Monstrance holding our Eucharistic Lord. All are invited to join us each Tuesday night for the Holy Hour for as much time as they are available. You do not need to be there the entire time.

CHOIR REHEARSAL:

If anyone is interested in singing in the choir, practice is held on Wednesdays nights starting at 6pm! All are welcome! We are looking for more members to enhance the music at our 10am Mass, so please consider joining.

MEMORIAL OPPORTUNITIES:

Praying for our loved ones who have died, and having Masses offered, is the greatest thing that we can do for them. I am aware that there are limited Masses in which to remember your loved ones, and so, I have asked a priest friend of mine who is working at the Vatican and does not have a parish, to take some of these Mass Intentions. For those who would like to utilize this special opportunity, please do so with the parish office. Please know that these Mass intentions will NOT be published in the weekly bulletin, but the list of names will go directly to the priest himself. I am able to send him approximately 10 intentions per month.

PRAYERS FOR VOCATIONS

Each Thursday morning, following the 9am Morning Mass, the diocesan prayer for vocations is prayed. It is the responsibility of each of us to pray for increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, in particular here in our own parish. CATECHESIS ON THE HOLY MASS

Where did the Mass come from? From Jesus himself, at the Last Supper. When he said, "This is My Body" and "This is My Blood," he gave the Eucharist to his disciples. When he said, "Do this in memory of Me," he gave it to us, all the faithful in the Church, down through the centuries. The Consecration is the very core and center of the Mass that we celebrate; everything else prepares for this moment or refers back to it. Given the holiness of this divine act, we prepare even before it begins.

As we enter the church, we bless ourselves with Holy Water. We may stop to pray at the statues of the saints at the entranceway. Before we enter the pew, we genuflect in reverence toward the Blessed Sacrament, looking directly at the tabernacle. Having entered the pew, we kneel in prayer for a few moments, turning our minds and hearts to God. All this is a gradual preparation for our participation in the Mass, a slowing down of our usual pace, which can be so harried and distracted. We need to focus all our attention on what is about to be accomplished in our midst. *Next week: Being there*.
