*Some random thoughts by the pastor ...*

One of the subjects that I had in college was chemistry. I must admit ... it wasn't a subject that was dear to my heart. Despite my feelings toward the subject, I did learn that creation is connected. Our second reading this weekend from the First Letter of John also recognizes that all of creation is connected. The author makes clear that it is impossible for us to love God without our also loving other people and all of creation. That is, we can't pick and choose who and what and when we will love. Either we love, or we don't love. The image often used for love is a flowing stream. When we prevent a stream from flowing, the river bed dries; and even if we undam the stream (by a willingness on our part to practice love) it takes time for the flow to begin again. It isn't - in other words - instantaneous. Like all things, practice is needed to help keep the steam flowing. It is little wonder, then, that Jesus tells us to practice by loving our enemies. God is good.

**Parish updates:** We are grateful for the many years of service that **Ray Brien** offered to Christ the King Parish. His tenure began with Father George Allard and continued until recently. His commitment to detail (this was most evident in the 'improvements' he would make to doll houses that he was creating) enabled a fifty seven year old steam boiler to operate long after it should have surrendered to age. He and Bob Blanchard would care for the woodwork, the benches, and the decorations, and Bob Lavoie would help with the Saturday afternoon Mass. Ray (who has a plethora of stories) made sure that a (rectory) key was hid for Father Ricard, the lawn was cut, and the pathways cleared of snow. His name was on nearly every invoice, and his telephone number was the first called when something needed doing. Ray (an early riser) would usually open the church by 6:30 on Sunday morning (sometimes earlier) regardless of the weather. (I would always smile - and sometimes scold him - when he would arrive in a snowstorm in his dress shoes!) He continues to participate in the 8:00 Mass on Sunday, usually arriving with his daughter, Anne, 30 minutes before Mass begins. (He doesn't like to be late.) Thank you, Ray, for your many years of dedicated service!
