*Some random thoughts by the pastor ...*

Today's gospel story from Mark is so familiar to many of us that we tend to tune-it-out as simply another healing story. The writer, however, does something so obvious that it is hidden in plain sight! Mark puts a story within a story and then links them with the number twelve (12). The deceased daughter of Jairus, we are told, is twelve (12) years old, the woman who hemorrhages has been afflicted for twelve (12) years. Building upon the theme of virginity and barrenness that is prevalent in the Scriptures, Mark intimates that both the young girl (who has reached an age in which she can give birth to children) and the woman who hemorrhages (and therefore cannot give birth) are being prevented from living as God creates us (to give life). Jesus, who acts as a conduit for God's power, heals both so that now they are able to give life. This is the action of God in our lives too. We are created in God's image so that it comes naturally for us to bring forth life. Many of us, however, choose the unnatural that prevents us from being generative, ironically, because it feels natural to us. The Good News that Jesus proclaims is that God is actively transforming us (we call this Grace) so that we can recognize (without judgment and with compassion) the ways in which we are choosing to prevent life so that we can also recognize (without judgment and with compassion) our natural desire to bring forth life. God is good.

**Parish updates:** We end our Fiscal Year on June 30<sup>th</sup>. We have, with the permission of the Finance Council, transferred \$10,000 from our general account (half of the proceeds from our Annual Bazaar) to the Capital Campaign account. We, in this way, hope to have sufficient funds to install Air Conditioning in the church proper sometime next May/June. (Please note that the installation of Air Conditioning in the church proper was included in the list of items when we announced the Capital Campaign, and therefore - by law - cannot be eliminated in favor of another project.) We will also be contacting - in the near future - an engineer to help us decide if it is possible to install an elevator in the church building, and if possible where is most feasible. Then, if it is possible to install an elevator and the site for the installation is a place that is easily accessed by those who would be using it, we would utilize this information (and the estimated cost) to apply for a grant.
