Some random thoughts by the pastor ...

The Scriptures present to us two worldviews. One is a creation of the ego-self in which judgment, competition, comparison, envy, hoarding, and fear unduly influence us to live in a very small and somewhat manageable world in which scarcity rules. This worldview requires us to 'get ours' before others 'get theirs' and because we are so fragile, to project onto others our failings. The other worldview is the creation of God in which mercy and compassion free us to embrace a world without limits. This worldview permits us to freely give of ourselves because we know that we have everything that we need in abundance. Our second reading this weekend (2 Corinthians) is Paul attempting to help the people of Corinth make the necessary choice (a daily choice) to live in God's worldview. It is a worldview that allows us to own our shortcomings ('a thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me') and recognize them as means by which he, Paul, can know the abundant power of God 'at work in him.' The gospel writer, Mark, reveals these two worldviews throughout the Gospel, and, in particular, (this week) with the people 'of his native place.' Those who 'take offense' (at Jesus) are said to be 'lacking in faith.' That is, they are not choosing to live in the worldview created by God (in which God provides for us with abundance). Rather, they are choosing to live in the worldview of their own making in which there is never enough for everyone (a sum zero value). God is good.

We then continue to clear away the buildup of leaves - and other debris that has accumulated in anticipation of the parking lot receiving a sealant coating.
