A SHORT REFLECTION

As we continue through the Sermon on the Mount, we must remember that although many see Jesus here as the new Moses, he is not acting as a lawgiver; but rather as a dispenser of wisdom. The Beatitudes were conundrums, counter intuitive sayings that make sense only when we reflect on them from practice. In addition, although the entire sermon is generally thought to be a collection of teachings rather than a homily delivered all at one time. Matthew framed it as a discourse and therefore wanted his readers to take it as such. With that in mind we need to remember that Jesus addressed the statements about salt and light to you, meaning those disciples to whom he had previously just stated "blessed are those who are persecuted."

A THOUGHT FOR TODAY

Mother Teresa of Calcutta needed two miracles to become Saint Teresa. It took some effort to identify these miracles and to verify them through eye witnesses. Throughout her life there were many miracles attributed to her and to the Missionaries of Charity sisters. One was the cure of an abdominal tumor and the second was the cure of a Brazilian suffering from multiple brain tumors. Both miracles were confirmed by medical doctors. To me it was the power of prayer directed thru Mother Teresa and the Missionaries of Charity sisters to attain something very good. Today's Gospel tells us that our light must shine before others so that they may see our good deeds which glorify our heavenly Father. Looking back on our Jubilee Year of Mercy the good deeds of St. Teresa are an inspiration to us which glories God. It was an inspiration to a world that acclaimed her.
