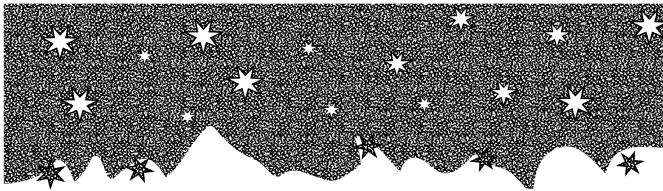

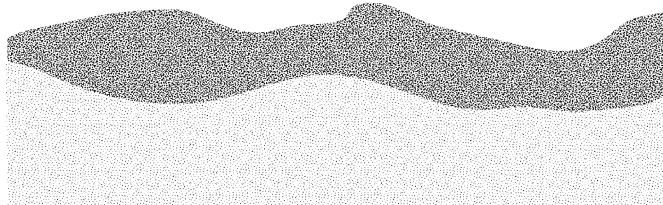

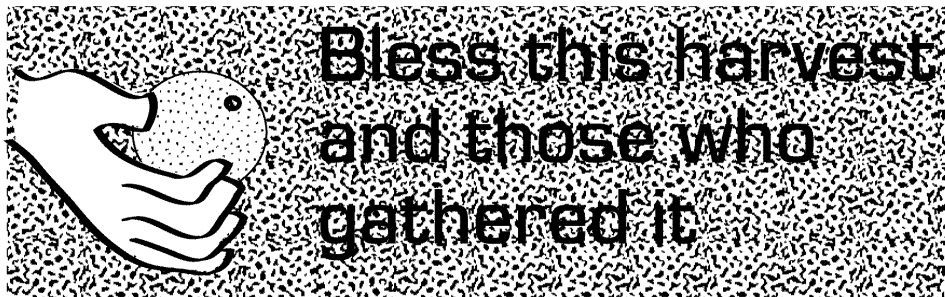

A THOUGHT FOR TODAY

We commonly read about labor disputes in the headlines of our newspapers. Labor disputes, like the one in today's Gospel story, have a long history dating back to 1754 B.C.E. with the Code of Hammurabi. It consists of 282 laws, including the famous ruling: "An eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth." But, even that far back in time, they were still arguing over the wages to be paid for an ox driver, a surgeon or a day laborer. Today's Gospel is not really about labor law. It is a powerful lesson which teaches that God is offering us the gift of eternal life. There is no way that we could ever earn it, much less to deserve it. This gift comes from the pure goodness of God who loves us more than we can ever comprehend.
