A SHORT REFLECTION

As we continue through the Sermon on the Mount, we must remember that although many see Jesus here as the new Moses, he is not acting as a lawgiver; but rather as a dispenser of wisdom. The Beatitudes were conundrums, counter intuitive sayings that make sense only when we reflect on them from practice. In addition, although the entire sermon is generally thought to be a collection of teachings rather than a homily delivered all at one time. Matthew framed it as a discourse and therefore wanted his readers to take it as such. With that in mind we need to remember that Jesus addressed the statements about salt and light to you, meaning those disciples to whom he had previously just stated "blessed are those who are persecuted."

MEDICAL MISSION TO HAITI

We are in final preparations to leave very early in the morning of February 1st. We have sixteen people going on this mission which includes a medical doctor, an eye doctor, two Nurse Practitioners, two Nurses and the rest of us are support staff such as pharmacy, intake staff who get blood pressures, weight, temperature and medical concerns of the patients. It will be an extremely busy week of hard work. We are taking with us roughly fifteen thousand dollars of medical supplies all of which has been donated. We will be leaving behind a large amount of these supplies that two local nurses can do follow-up throughout the year. We hope to see approximately 500 patients in the space of one week. The fun part is that it will be in eighties every day. In my absence Fr. Ambrose Ziegler will be saying the weekend Masses, and Fr. Leroy Kinnaman from Winamac will be handling any emergencies.
