



FRUITFUL HARVEST

I have not given up on reaching our goals. I have been making phone calls and it has been difficult in trying to find people at home. The goal for St. Anne in Monterey is \$19,348 and for St. Ann in Kewanna it is \$7,271. If those goals are reached then we would receive a 10% rebate. My goal is that we need to reach 90% of that goal which would be \$17,414 for Monterey and \$6,544 for Kewanna. If we reach that level then we don't need for the parishes to use parish funds to reach our goal. The actual campaign begins in January and runs for 20 months. At this point Monterey has \$15,025 in pledges and payments and Kewanna is at \$5,458. For Monterey it means that we have to raise about \$500 more than we collected for the last go round with Fruitful Harvest. Kewanna's goal is roughly \$700 less than the last go round of Fruitful Harvest. But we had to pay from parish funds over \$2,600 to reach that 90% level. If pledge levels stay the same for Kewanna this time it would mean that we would have to pay \$1,700 to reach the 90% level that is mandatory. I must admit that it would be very nice for both parishes to reach 100% of goal simply because that would mean a nice rebate for the parishes in October of 2018.
