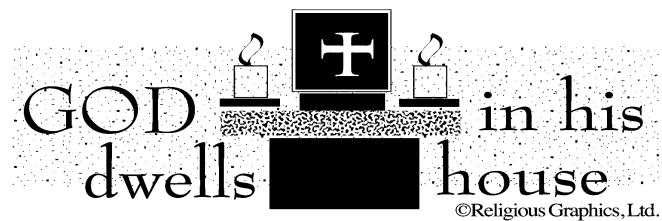

A THOUGHT FOR TODAY

It's probably not a good idea to teach you to play poker here at Mass. But the poker game, Texas hold 'em, has a good faith lesson for us. The game begins with two cards being dealt face down. The table of players evaluate their chances of a winning hand based on these first cards and then they make their first bets. Next, three additional common cards are dealt face up. More betting. Then the dealer lays down the fourth common card. It's here that very confident players bet everything by declaring "all in." There is one final card to come. If someone goes 'all in' the players are confronted with the choice of matching the bet or folding their hands and losing what they have thus far wagered. 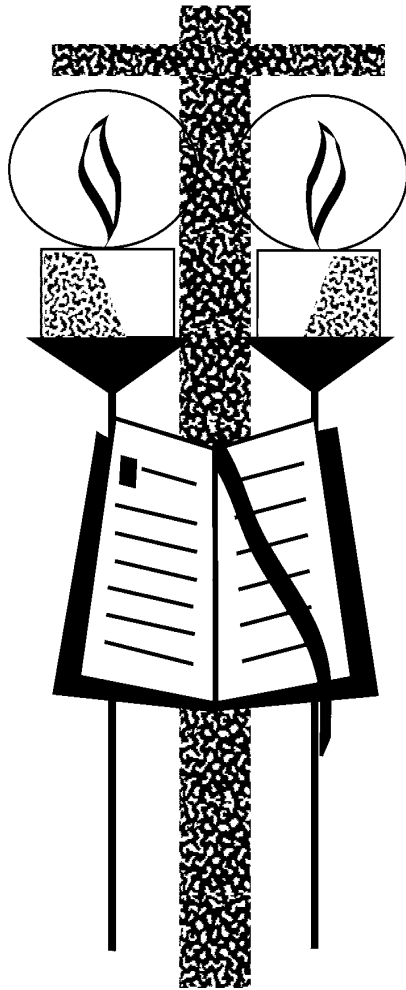

A SHORT REFLECTION

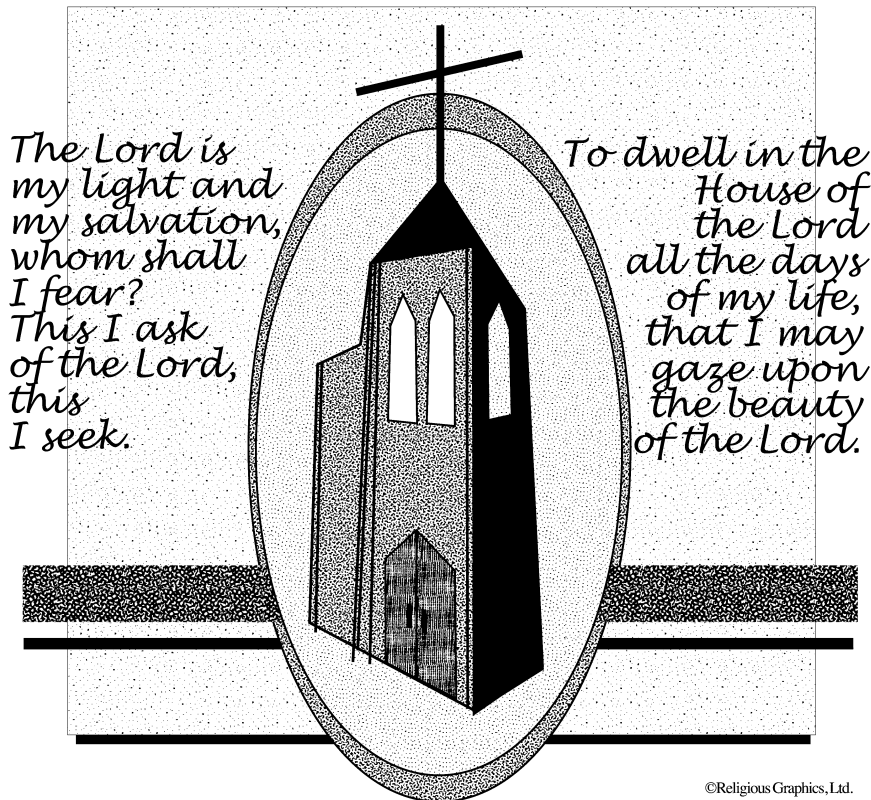

MEDICAL MISSION TO HAITI

We are in final preparations to leave very early in the morning of February 1st. We have sixteen people going on this mission which includes a medical doctor, an eye doctor, two Nurse Practitioners, two Nurses and the rest of us are support staff such as pharmacy, intake staff who get blood pressures, weight, temperature and medical concerns of the patients. It will be an extremely busy week of hard work. We are taking with us roughly fifteen thousand dollars of medical supplies all of which has been donated. We will be leaving behind a large amount of these supplies that two local nurses can do follow-up throughout the year. We hope to see approximately 500 patients in the space of one week. The fun part is that it will be in eighties every day.
