From the Pastor

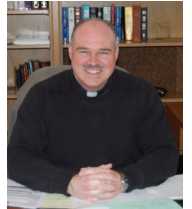
Dear Parishioners,

You might be surprised to know that this weekend's Feast, the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, was the subject of quite a controversy in the early Church and even at one point, helped fuel a schism. When we think about it, it seems so benign: Mary was the mother of Jesus Christ, whom we all profess every Sunday as both true God and true man. No big deal, right?

Well, in the hindsight of 15 centuries of Christian thought, it might not seem like much of an issue, but going into the 5th century it was a very big deal, and the unity of the Church was at stake over the whole thing. Cyril of Alexandria was the champion of the belief that Mary was what was termed in Greek as "Theotokos," or literally, the God-Bearer. Peak in at his thoughts: *"I am amazed that there are some who are entirely in doubt as to whether the holy Virgin should be called Theotokos or not. For if our Lord Jesus Christ is God, how is the holy Virgin who gave Him birth, not Theotokos?"* (from his first Epistle to the monks of Egypt). Yet others, most notably Nestorius, who was the Patriarch of Constantinople (modern day Istanbul) saw the two natures of Christ as distinct, preferring to view Mary at the "Christotokos" (the bearer of Christ) but not the bearer of God.

The Council of Ephesus (431 A.D.) and the Council of Chalcedon (451 A.D.) saw it differently and condemned Nestorius and his teachings. At one point in 5th century Mesopotamia, a Theotokos-supporting bishop was executed, making way for a Nestorius-supporter to take his place. This marked an early split in Christianity, with elements of this schism even surviving today in parts of Iraq, Syria and Iran. Serious business, this understanding of Mary, is!

Preparing for Mass

Visit <http://liturgy.slu.edu> to read this weekend's Scripture, historical and theological commentaries, and prayerful reflections. It is a great way to get ready to hear and respond to God's Word.

Our present celebration on January 1st dates back to 1969, which emphasizes the deep and lasting appreciation of Mary's motherhood from ancient feasts, and moved the Church away from the celebration of the circumcision of Christ (which, by tradition, would have been performed on the 8th day after His birth, hence, January 1st). Today, we honor Mary with many titles, including: Comfort of the Afflicted, Gate of Heaven, Holy Mary, Morning Star, Mother of Mercy, Mother of Sorrows, Mother of the Church, Our Lady, Star of the Sea, Queen of All Saints, Queen of Apostles, Refuge of Sinners, and Untier of Knots. But Mother of God is perhaps her greatest title and encompasses her greatest gift to the Church: her willingness to say yes to God's plan and to be the mother of our Savior.

As we move into the New Year, may we invite her to pray for us, our families and our community. With the deep love that comes from a mother's heart, we couldn't ask for a better advocate and intercessor before Christ.

May God bless us all richly in 2017!

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will **not** meet on its regular first and third Sundays in January but will meet on the second and fourth Sundays, January 8 and January 22, at 2:00 p.m. in the IC Parish Center. This would be an ideal time for interested members of the Collaborative to join the study group as we will begin the New Year by reading and discussing *The Gospel According to Matthew*, Chapters 1 through 4. Matthew wrote from a Jewish perspective for a predominantly Jewish audience that also included some Gentiles, probably in Antioch, Syria around 85 A.D.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

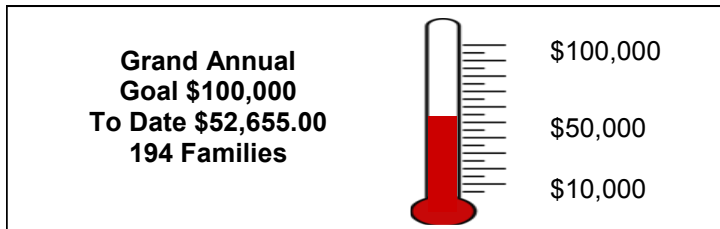

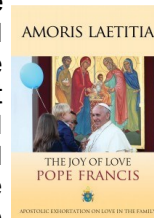

Amoris Laetitia...Pope Francis

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. In the weeks to come, you will be introduced to various statements from the Holy Father.

The Sacrament of Matrimony—In #72—The sacrament of marriage is not a social convention, an empty ritual or merely the outward sign of a commitment. The sacrament is a gift given for the sanctification and salvation of the spouses, since “their mutual belonging is a real representation, through the sacramental sign, of the same relationship between Christ and the Church. The married couple are therefore a permanent reminder for the Church of what took place on the cross; they are for one another and for their children witnesses of the salvation in which they share through the sacrament.” Marriage is a vocation, inasmuch as it is a response to a specific call to experience conjugal love as an imperfect sign of the love between Christ and the Church. Consequently, the decision to marry and to have a family ought to be fruit of a process of vocational discernment.
