

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Many years ago when I was newlyordained, an older priest-friend of mine invited me to go out to Notre Dame University in Indiana to take in a football game. This was a highly-ritualized, highly-scripted event, beginning with



the rally the night before, parade, and eventually the sacred game itself, held in the shadow of "Touch-Down Jesus." Some pub-crawling and tailgating were also required activities to round off the weekend. Can't mess with the ritual, you know!

In addition to all of the above, we also spent some time touring the area and visiting a number of churches, including a few a little further away in Michigan. While there, I had the occasion to meet a very humble and genuine bishop named Ken Untener. He was the Bishop of the Saginaw Diocese. I'd have to say that he was the most down-to-earth person, never mind, bishop, that I have ever met. There was absolutely no pretense about the man. At his invitation, everyone called him "Ken." He was a sports fanatic, a phenomenal preacher, he enjoyed a good joke as much as anyone and loved to be with people—any people who care to spend some time with him. He basically lived out of his car, travelling from one rectory to the next across the patchwork of parishes that made up his diocese. While he had many qualities that could impress even the harshest skeptic, one that stood out for me one night was his insistence of cleaning up after a late-night parish meeting.

After the sacred football rituals were satisfied (Notre Dame creamed USC that weekend, as I recall) we attended a talk that Ken was giving at an area parish. I don't remember anything of what he said, only that after what had to have been a very long day of masses, diocesan meetings, appointments, and more, he insisted on helping the hospitality people in this parish wipe down tables and clean coffee urns. Given his position and many weighty responsibilities, it would have been more than understandable if he had left shortly after his presentation that evening. But he wouldn't leave until the last person had turned off the lights and locked the door. From what I have been told by many who knew him well, he always did this, was always the last one to go home, no matter how late it was or how tired he might have been. Oh, and he only had one leg. He was fitted with an artificial knee and lower leg, having lost one limb when he was a young man. As tired as any of us with two good legs might have been at the end of a long day, I can't imagine how exhausted he must have been with only one good leg. If it did bother him, he never let on, though. Ken served the people of Saginaw until his death from leukemia in 2004.

I think of Ken when I hear today's Gospel story about the greatest among us being the servant of all. I am ashamed to say that I have failed miserably at imitating his example of humble service, at least in this regard. While I have certainly done my share of locking doors and putting out lights over the years, there have been just as many

moments when a crazy schedule, sheer fatigue, or personal needs have seen me leaving an event early. I don't know how Ken was able to do what he did with all of the other burdens in his life, but I think this Gospel passage must have been a powerful motivator and guidepost in his ministry to the people of Saginaw. The measure of true greatness is found in the totality of humble service to the little ones that surround us in life, Jesus teaches. True greatness is experienced in an emptying of the self, a profound simplicity of orienting our lives towards the needs of others.

It is found, I think, in the grandparent who rearranges their day at the last minute to care for a sick grandchild, or a neighbor who stays up all night with a despondent friend following a divorce, or a first-responder who leaves spouse and children at home to rush into a burning building or confront an armed felon. True greatness is found, I think, in those who get up at 2am to go and prepare food for strangers at a shelter. It is seen in abundance in the consistency of patience that newly-minted parents muster while nurturing a newborn. It is experienced in significant measure whenever a nurse or home health aid listens attentively to yet one more rendition of an oft-told-tale from decades ago. It is witnessed in the classroom every day in every city, town, and village when a teacher goes the extra mile to help one of their students "get it."

You see, greatness is meant to be part of our daily lives—not something that we have to travel far and wide to see. It is supposed to be part of our everyday journey with the Lord. It comes, I think, when our prayer for others' needs is so focused, it can't help but overflow into action. We are great when we serve up a healthy portion of Jesus Christ to those who so desperately hunger for his love, need his compassion, and pine for his mercy.

Without doing anything different today, where do you find true greatness in your life? How might it be something that you can share with others in Christ's name?

Wishing you and your family an abundance of everyday greatness this week! Please keep those of us travelling on our Pilgrimage to Northern Italy in your prayers, as we will be carrying all of you in our hearts. I look forward to being with you soon.



IC Haiti Update

Over the summer, thanks to the generosity of parishioners, we were able to send a check for \$61,928 to fund the 2018 -19 school year budget for the Fr. Marc Piché Elementary School in Puit Chacha, to provide scholarships for all students moving on to the seventh grade in Fondes Blanc, and to finance a dental program for the entire school community. Again, thanks to your continued support, we plan to provide further scholarships for those students who will be moving on to eighth grade next year.

Unfortunately, there was a 5.9-magnitude earthquake that hit the north coast of Haiti a few weeks ago. There were no effects of the quake felt in the southern peninsula near Puit Chacha. However, this is a reminder that natural disasters (earthquakes, hurricanes, and floods) can strike at any time, and we need to be prepared to support our school community with relief funds. For this purpose, we have established a fund balance to maintain a threshold level so we can be prepared to respond quickly in an emergency while continuing to preserve sufficient funds to honor our long-term commitment to the school community.
