From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As you read this, our Pilgrimage group will be in Athens, readying ourselves for our tour of the capital city of Greece and our eventual Mass and journey to Corinth the next day. Although I am sure the trip will have its challenges, it will be an amazing opportunity to pray and reflect on how St. Paul helped to spread the Gospel out into the wider world beyond Jerusalem and Palestine.



As part of my personal preparation for this adventure, I am finishing reading an excellent book entitled, Paul: His Story by Jerome Murphy-O'Connor (Oxford University Press, 2006). Rather than a dry biblical commentary (and trust me, sometimes they can be very dry!) this book is more of a narrative of Paul's life with many details and life-scenario's imagined or filled-in by Murphy-O'Connor's extensive knowledge of Scripture and Mediterranean life from the First Century. It is an easy read, but filled with a great deal of richness and plenty of vivid details from Paul's life and journeys as testified in the Bible. It is a threedimensional portrayal of Paul as a person, a Pharisee, a Christian convert and finally as our Church's greatest Apostle. For those who were not able to join us on this Pilgrimage but want to have a taste of Paul's missionary journeys, this is an excellent read! Of course, Paul's many letters in the New Testament as well as the Book of Acts itself are must-reads too!

Many of you have asked myself and others going on the trip to pray for you and your families as we make our way around the Aegean Sea. I want to assure all of you that our Pilgrimage is a journey of faith and prayer and we will be praying for all in our Collaborative as we visit and celebrate Mass in the various sites that Paul first preached the Gospel. Our prayers and liturgies along the way will give us many opportunities to carry all of you and your needs in our hearts. I would ask you to please pray for us as well. I look forward to being able to share with you many stories and insights that were gained when we return.

I will be praying in a particular way for our nation in these final days leading up to the elections on November 8. I am voting early before leaving on the Pilgrimage, just in case our travel plans get delayed in any way. Like all of you, I have found this year's choices to be excruciatingly difficult to make, and have spent many weeks thinking, praying, and engaging in many conversations with others about what is the right path to follow. As I mentioned several weeks ago in another bulletin column, I think our choices must flow from our well-formed consciences. So, think hard, pray hard and go with confidence into the voting booths next week. I invite you to join with me in asking for God's blessing on us all in the midst of this process.



to teachers, it is because they are witnesses."

Sharing Mercy...Sarah Swafford

Ignorant is from the Latin meaning "not knowing." It can also mean "unlearned," "unknown," or even "unaware...."

In light of trying to dig deeper into this work of mercy, instruct the ignorant, I think it would be beneficial to distinguish between knowledge and wisdom. Knowledge is very important; we should have the facts and information we need to communicate the brilliant truths of our Catholic faith.

It is wisdom and faith that take knowledge and seamlessly weave it through the threads of time, history, culture and personal experience in order to help answer life's biggest questions: "Who am I?" "What am I living for?" and "Whom am I living for?" Wisdom and faith are the anchors of human life, giving us meaning and purpose even amid the attacks of relativism, utilitarianism, and the culture of death. Wisdom and faith show us that life has a plot, a goal, and a living out this journey leads to happiness, peace and joyboth in this life and in the next.


