

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I don't blame Naaman the Syrian army general for not wanting to bath in the Jordan River. If you take a good look at the bulletin cover, you will see it is green with algae and hardly inviting, even for a swim



on a hot day. One might want to take a bath after bathing in the Jordan! The story from our first reading runs, of course, deeper than that.

Naaman, filled with his own importance and wrapped in the trappings of power and prestige, thought that, surely, to be cured of such an insidious disease as leprosy, something truly extraordinary was required. Magical incantations, lengthy, potent prayers...the personal attention of the prophet Elisha, at least?! Elisha didn't even have the good manners to come out of his tent and talk to Naaman! He simply sent a message through a servant that told him to wash in the Jordan seven times.

While he was tempted to walk away in anger, one of his servants pleaded with him to do as he was told. So, humbling himself, he washed seven times... and was cured. The lesson is subtle if not persistent: do what God tells you, even if it seems too easy or simple, or too humiliating or undignified. God's blessings work through those who obey his Word.

In the Gospel, we have a similar scene where this time, ten lepers were healed at Jesus' word. But always using the lens of the wider community in any healing miracle, the bigger picture includes restoring these now-healed lepers to their communities which would have been shunning them due to the nature of their disease and the strictness of their purity laws. Only a priest could lift the guarantine that the Law imposed on lepers by proclaiming them officially healed. Presumably, nine of them went off and did what they were told to do. But therein lies the problem: one of the lepers was a Samaritan, and would not have been allowed to present himself to the Jewish priests in the Temple in Jerusalem. Samaritans were not welcome there.

So, he did the only thing he could think of under the circumstances. He returned to Jesus to give thanks to God. Symbolically, Jesus is the new Temple and High Priest. So, Luke's Gospel story prefigures the fulfillment and Salvation that was to take place in Christ, which would be offered to all nations, Samaria included.

Naaman the foreigner did what he was told to do and was healed by the Lord. The lepers in the Gospel did what Christ told them to do and were healed. Even the hated Samaritan found a path of healing and salvation by following Christ's words.

Though we may not be suffering from a dreaded skin disease that separates us from God, from our families and the community in which we live, we nonetheless suffer from the ravages of sin which can take away all of these things and lead to eternal death. Christ's words to us to accept his healing and forgiveness remain the same today as they were centuries ago. The big question is will we listen to his voice and do what he tells us?

May God give each of us strength this week to hear the Lord's voice and follow his will in our lives.

Fr. Broderick's Scripture Study

Scripture Study Will Meet on October 16

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will meet on its regular third Sunday of the month on October 16 at 2:00 p.m. in the IC Parish Center. We will be reading and discussing Chapters 52 through 56 in *The Book of Isaiah*, completing the section known as The Book of Consolation. The Book of Consolation is generally attributed to an anonymous poet who prophesied toward the end of the Babylonian exile and contains the great messianic oracles known as the Suffering Servant songs. Chapter 56 begins Part III, Return of the First Captives, which contains oracles from a later period, composed by disciples who continued the work of the great prophet.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

In such difficult situations of need, the Church must be particularly concerned to offer understanding, comfort and acceptance, rather than imposing straightaway a set of rules that only lead people to feel judged and abandoned by the very Mother called to show them God's mercy.
