From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

A few years ago, a close friend's wife died from cancer. She had been diagnosed only a year before, and her passing was filled with all of the sadness and emotion that you might imagine would accompany such



a painful journey. She was a woman of deep faith and of great love for her family and friends. I have all the confidence in the world that she is now peacefully enjoying the fullness of God's Kingdom. I hope to see her again, when it is my turn to enter into that mystery.

My friend was devastated over the loss. Although they never had children of their own, they regularly gathered extended family and friends around their dining room table for meals that often went on for many hours, filled with good food, choice wines, and lots of laughter. Several weeks after her passing, my friend invited a number of us to his home for Easter dinner. It was a somber gathering compared to previous meals, yet we all knew how important it was to come together nonetheless. At the start of the meal, however, my friend did something that broke my heart. He pulled out a very rare bottle of wine, a very expensive one that he and his wife had been saving, religiously, for a special occasion. It had been a wedding gift to them both from some years before. Sadly, his wife never got to savor its delicate flavors. What a bittersweet experience it was to share a glass of fine wine with a close friend, knowing that it was meant for so much more...a blessing that was to have been shared with at least one other. That is a regret that is unquenchable.

I think of that painful experience when I ponder this weekend's Gospel and the parable of the talents. Realizing that it is first and foremost not a lesson on economics. ancient or present-day, one thing I think we can take away from it is a potent challenge to take the blessings of the present and utilize them in some way for the purposes of furthering the Kingdom. And there is risk in doing that! You never know what lament might lie right around the corner if something is spent too quickly, something exhausted before its time, something not appropriately rationed. But the Gospel warns us of a different kind of lament, one that we will not be able to overcome with future joy. It is the regret of not rejoicing enough when there was plenty to rejoice over. It is the sadness that will come if we do not find some way to bask in the present joy of being part of God's Kingdom in the here and now. It is not only meant for some later-on event, at some undetermined future point in time. Although we will only experience it's completeness later on, we are called to be part of it now. And that means wringing every drop of life and joy, laughter and love out of every moment that we have.

The servant with one talent in the Gospel wasn't criticized because he didn't find some way to double his money or wasn't as resourceful as the others. He wasn't even

chastised because he tried and failed to make more money. He was lambasted because he didn't try at all. He buried something immensely valuable and refused to even attempt to do anything with it. He was paralyzed with fear and crippled with the ever self-defeating thought of "what if." What if he lost money and his master would become angry? What if he somehow screwed it up and everyone made fun of him? What if he tried and didn't measure up? His master only gave him a little of what he gave to the other servants because he already had seen him as less capable. What if he lived up to those expectations and confirmed their low opinion of him? What if? What he forgot, was that it wasn't all about him. It was about his master's joy, and his duty to do everything he could to participate in it.

When they began their marriage journey together, I'm sure my friends never dreamed of how it would end and under what heartbreaking circumstances they would part. Maybe having that one special bottle of wine on their shelf over the years was a symbol for them of something better and more joyful yet to come. Maybe it gave them hope that the best life had to offer was still in front of them....

On the other hand, I am certain that in hindsight, if given a "do-over," my friend would gladly have cracked that precious bottle on the most ordinary, boring, and mundane of days he and his wife had shared together and toasted with her the trivialities and inconsequential nonsense of daily life. Looking back, in the simplest of the simple is the richest of the rich. It doesn't get any more special than that.

So, a few questions for the present: What blessings has God given me today? How am I using them presently to celebrate and make real God's Kingdom in some way? If God were to ask for an account of how I am living my life right now, how would I answer? What regrets would I have? In light of my own answers to the above, what might I consider doing differently? Remember, ultimately it isn't all about us. It is about participating in something bigger, more joyful, and permanent than what we presently see and experience. What could we do to engage that in the here and now?

Amoris Laetitia...Pope Francis

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Marrying for Love: In #132: To opt for marriage in this way expresses a genuine and firm decision to join paths, come what may. Given its seriousness, this public commitment of love cannot be the fruit of a hasty decision, but neither can it be postponed indefinitely. Committing oneself exclusively and definitively to another person always involves a risk and a bold gamble. Unwillingness to make such a commitment is selfish, calculating and petty. It fails to recognize the rights of another person and to present him or her to society as someone worthy of unconditional love. If two persons are truly in love, they naturally show this to others. When love is expressed before others in the marriage contract, with all its public commitments, it clearly indicates and protects the "yes" which those persons speak freely and unreservedly to each other. This "yes" tells them that they can always trust one another, and that they will never be abandoned when difficulties arise or new attractions or selfish interests present themselves.
