From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I'm not really a morning person. One of the things that I don't like about being a priest is that so much happens in the morning: early morning Mass, morning meetings, the early start of our school, and occasional call to the hospital....



You would think by now, after 25 years of ministry, that I would be used to it all. Maybe that is why God invented coffee. Don't talk to me until I've had a cup or two....

In my spare time, I have enjoyed amateur photography as a hobby. My friends all make fun of me for all of the sunset pictures I've taken over the years. I've got gigabytes and gigabytes worth sitting on my hard drive. Some are truly postcard-worthy. Many are just archived because I cannot resist snapping away when the sun starts its daily dip toward the horizon. But I have so few sunrise pictures.

Again, maybe it is because I'm just not a morning person, but it may also have to do with what St. Paul refers to in his Letter to the Romans: the drowsiness our body clocks inflict on us. Particularly in these late fall days, sometimes it takes a small nuclear device to rouse many of us from our slumber to be about the start of our day in the pre-dawn darkness.

In many ways, this is precisely the experience of Advent. To be awake and struggling to see the light that will assuredly come on the horizon. To be cloaked in darkness, but eagerly seeking the light. To be waiting with anticipation for the first rays of the sun. When the sky begins its ever-so-subtle shift from pitch darkness to the very first hues of the deepest dark violet blue, we know that so much more is to come. When the sun finally bursts above the horizon, its dazzling display is enough to make even the grumpiest of us pause and smile. A new day brings new hope and the promise of new opportunities and life.

In the Church, this brief season of Advent reminds us that Christ is coming into the world. He is the light of the world, and as disciples, we must be watching and waiting for even the faintest glimpse of that light on the horizon. We cannot do that if we are slumbering. We must be awake and alert to welcome the dawn. To this end, we are invited at the beginning of Advent every year to examine how we are living our lives and whether there are any changes that need to be made to better welcome Christ when He comes. It's not simply a quick touch-up before Christmas, but an honest assessment of whether we are really ready to see the Lord when He returns. Advent has this two-fold character: to prepare for the celebration of Christ's first coming at Christmas, and to prepare for His Second Coming on a day and at a time we do not know.



The Christmas season is officially underway, and I can feel the spirit all around me. Nowhere is this spirit blazing more brightly than among the many volunteers who come together to prepare for our annual North Pole

Express (NPE), taking place this Saturday, December 3rd.

For sixteen years, the Immaculate Conception School (IC) has produced this spectacular event. Over 350 volunteers including teachers, faculty, students and parents, alumni and local residents join together, giving their time and talents to create the enchanting atmosphere that brings families back year after year.

Father Tim and I will be among the 35 "readers" sharing the story of the *The Night Before Christmas* to the over 3,700 riders on their way to the North Pole. Two hundred and fifty gallons of cocoa will be prepared and distributed by 105 food servers. Other volunteers include 35 conductors, 30 merchandise salespeople, 30 platform managers, 32 decorators, 30 ticket scanners, 3 musicians, 3 sound technicians, 35 cleaners, 8 characters and 75 elves! This event requires approximately 7,000 volunteer hours—a remarkable example of how our community comes together in love and spirit.

The proceeds from this event, along with the generous donations of our school sponsors and in-kind contribution, help to defray the cost of tuition for students attending the IC. We are so grateful for this support.

I want to thank everyone for their commitment of time, talent, and enthusiasm, especially Tara McQuaid and Bianca Riethmueller, chairs of this event. The North Pole Express is a truly magical experience for children and parents alike!

Fr. James Mallon...Scandalous Mercy

When we receive mercy, we are filled with mercy and will be merciful. There is no shortcut. The key to being free of hurt, resentment, bitterness, and unforgiveness, the key to living out the spiritual work of mercy of forgiving all injuries is to cry out to God for mercy for our own sins and to experience the scandalous, unjust, lavish, outrageous mercy of God. When we experience this at the depth of our being it will utterly transform us. Our attempts to hold on to past grievances and harden our hearts to those who have caused us injury will seem to be mere comedy. Indeed, when we contemplate our injuries and those who inflicted them upon us, we see that some may still be inexcusable, but none will be unforgiveable.
