

#### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

The cover picture on this week's bulletin might seem a bit strange—why portray a Muslim woman at prayer when Jesus is talking about the Scribes and the Pharisees and the "Seat of Moses?" On



last year's pilgrimage we made a side journey to Istanbul, Turkey, formerly known as Constantinople – an early center of Christianity more than 1500 years ago. In the course of history, Muslims came to conquer the area. Although Turkey is now a secular country, it still hosts a vibrant Muslim community who worship regularly in the mosques that dominate its landscape.

As part of our tour, we visited one of the largest mosques in the world, and were welcomed as visitors into the main worship space. It was a magnificent building, opulent in its mosaics and gilded decorations, yet serene and simple in its design. A large, open space was covered in decorative oriental carpets. This is where the men would gather regularly at different hours throughout the day to offer their prayers. In the back, in a screened-off section that was lacking in much of the grandeur of the main body, was a small area where the women would be allowed to come in and offer their prayers. In order to do so, their heads must be covered, as well as much of their bodies. No bikinis allowed here! With some blurring for privacy, I snapped this simple picture of a woman who quietly came in to pray while we were passing through. What struck me most about her simple faith was the great humility she offered in her posture before God. Denied the freedom to sit where she might want to, to dress how she might please, she nonetheless bowed her head and prayed. Her action was not about herself or what rights she might claim for herself. It was about God, plain and simple. And God could be spoken to equally well from the front or the back of the mosque. This was about her opening her heart to God. It was a beautiful, sacred moment.

Now, to be fair, this same scene has been repeated and played-out in our own churches many hundreds of times each week. While the vast throng of our worshippers come in and go out all at once, there are always a handful of people who come in early or remain afterwards to prayer

quietly. Their heads are bowed, their hands often folded in prayer or open as in a quite surrender to the God of love and mercy. Sometimes there are tears and not a few rosary beads in motion. No religion has the market cornered when it comes to prayer.

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus invites us gently to witness to our faith, not by making a big show of it or looking for praise or marks of honor from others, but to live it out quietly and simply. Our little acts of faithfulness will speak genuinely to others whose hearts are seeking. Some of the holiest people I know sit right next to you in the pews each week. They may never be canonized in a glitzy ceremony in Rome or get a stained-glass window dedicated in their honor; but they will have a seat one day at the heavenly banquet table. Hopefully, you and I will be there to enjoy it with them.

Let us rejoice, simply, in the many gifts with which God blesses us each day. In genuine humility, we encounter the presence of God in our midst.

## **Scripture Study**

#### Scripture Study will meet on November 5

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will meet on November 5 at 2:00 p.m. in the IC Parish Center, on the regular schedule of the first Sunday of the month. Interested members of the Collaborative are invited to join the study group as we read and discuss The Acts of the Apostles, Chapters 21-24. In this second book, written between 80 and 90 A.D., Luke continues the story of Christianity in the first century. These chapters focus on St. Paul's return to Jerusalem and his appearance before the council of elders to defend his faithfulness as a Jew, which was contested by some. He was taken into custody by the Roman soldiers. He appeared before the Sanhedrin and again was taken into Roman protection. When a plot to kill Paul was reported, he was transported to Caesarea to the custody of the Roman governor, Felix, where Paul remained for the two years Felix was in charge.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

#### Amoris Laetitia...Pope Francis

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Joy and beauty: In #129: The joy of this contemplative love needs to be cultivated. Since we were made for love, we know that there is no greater joy than that of sharing good things: "Give, take, and treat yourself well" (Sir 14:16). The most intense joys in life arise when we are able to elicit joy in others, as a foretaste of heaven. We can think of the lovely scene in the film Babette's Feast, when the generous cook receives a grateful hug and praise: "Ah, how you will delight the angels!" It is a joy and a great consolation to bring delight to others, to see them enjoying themselves. This joy, the fruit of fraternal love, is not that of the vain and self-centered, but of lovers who delight in the good of those whom they love, who give freely to them and thus bear good fruit.
