Dear Friends in Christ,

It is a joy to welcome all of you to our annual celebration of the Birth of the Lord! Christmas is a magical time of the year when our hearts are rendered docile and we focus, maybe just for the moment, on the inherent goodness that God calls us to reflect back into our world.
