From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

I don't know about you, but I constantly find myself sorting things. Start with the mail, for example. Before I even get to my desk, two-thirds of it is already tossed into the trash: the ads, junk mail, credit card applications, solicita-



tions, catalogues, etc.... It is particularly brutal this time of year! I find myself doing the same to email and even text messages these days.... Ughh. Maybe it is just part of human nature—we have too many things that are competing for our attention or, rather, our money! There is never enough to go around, so we have to pick and choose, sort and discard that which we can let go of.

Additionally, there are moments when we have to pick out those things which do not belong. For example, I made pumpkin bread over the Thanksgiving holiday. Of course, in cracking a few eggs into the mixture, some pieces of eggshells fell in as well. There was great temptation to just ignore it and stir a bit more...but my conscience (and the image of my mother staring over my shoulder giving me "the look") made me pause and then carefully pick out the offending bits. No one wants crunchy pumpkin bread, after all! In a worse-case scenario, failing to properly sort items could be disastrous. Forget to take off your watch and jewelry before having an MRI and you could be in for more entertainment than you imagine!

Oil and water don't mix, especially in your car's engine. Neither do sin and grace in God's Eternal Kingdom. They must be sorted and separated so that only the good enters the eternity that God has prepared. Otherwise, like a train wreck in slow motion, the true harmony that God wills for us might erode and dissipate. God demands that it be otherwise. So it must be sorted and refined. The "it" being us, creation.

The image of a winnowing fan clearing a threshing floor invites us to consider the breeze that will easily separate the light, useless chaff from the hearty and more solid

kernel of grain. On this week's bulletin cover you can see a close-up of both, and it is not too hard to imagine how even the gentlest of zephyrs would whisk the chaff or outer husk of the wheat away, leaving only the good grain left to be harvested and made into flour, then cakes and breads... who knows, maybe even pumpkin bread?!

The preaching of John the Baptist is that wind of the Spirit, calling people to conversion, inviting us to let go of our sinful ways and believe in the good news of God's forgiveness. His words were sharp and challenging for those who clung to their old manner of life and perhaps had gotten too comfortable with the idea of compromise and mediocrity. John saw no middle ground when it came to following God. It was: "repent or suffer the consequences!" There was a real urgency in his voice, as he was keenly aware of the imminent coming of the Lord. There was no time to think it over, no time to consider the possibilities and maybe, someday, make a greater commitment. No, it was now! Right Now! John was as offensive as he was effective.

I think there is part of John the Baptist that should bother all of us a bit. The Lord came 2000 years ago and John was his herald. But the Church also believes that Christ will return and come again—on a day and at a time that no one knows. It is comforting and joyful to celebrate the babe born in Bethlehem of old. It is downright terrifying to face His judgment tomorrow or the day after next! And yet, we don't really know when He will return, or when any of us will face our own death and a just reckoning of how we have lived our lives. The only thing we know is that it will come some day....Wisdom, Prudence, and every other virtue calls us to live our lives well now, watching and being ready for whatever may come. If we do enough of the sorting in the present, God won't have to question whether we belong in His Eternal Kingdom to come. We will already be living it out in the here and now, anticipating its fulfillment and completion in the time to come. What is one sin that I can let go of this week?

May these Advent days be filled with many blessings for us all.





IC Haiti

In the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew, you responded with a generosity that far exceeded the expectations of IC-Haiti's Board of Directors. Thanks to your generosity we raised \$35,000 in the month of October. We've sent \$30,000 to aid in hurricane relief efforts and will send another \$5,000 as soon as we are made aware of the costs to repair any structural damages to the Father Marc Piché Immaculate Conception School in Puit Chacha. We want to assure you that IC-Haiti has been and continues to be a good steward of the funds you have donated not only to aid recent hurricane relief efforts but also to continue to support the Father Marc school, its lunch program, and a variety of health programs run through the Saint Boniface Hospital complex in nearby Fond-des-Blancs. Since the beginning of 2015 and prior to sending our most recent hurricane relief donations, we've sent \$176,260 through the Saint Boniface Haiti Foundation to directly address these matters. During that time period, administrative costs here have amounted to less than 0.3% of all our expenditures.

On the weekend of **December 17–18**, we will be taking up the fourth and final IC-Haiti collection of this calendar year to support the school and vital health programs. We trust in the power of the Holy Spirit and the example of Jesus to continue to move your hearts and minds to meet the annual needs of our mission to the people of Haiti. We are confident that you will continue to respond with the same generosity that has provided education, sustenance, health care, and hope to our brothers and sisters in Haiti. Jesus Restores and Fulfills God's Plan-In #67-The Second Vatican Council, in its Pastoral Constitution Gaudium et Spes, was concerned "to promote the dignity of marriage and the family" (cf. #47-52). The Constitution "defined marriage as a community of life and love (cf. #48), placing love at the centre of the family... "True love between husband and wife' (49) involves mutual self-giving, includes and integrate the sexual and affective dimensions, in accordance with God's plan" (cf. 48-49). The conciliar document also emphasizes "the grounding of the spouses in Christ. Christ the Lord 'makes himself present to the Christian spouses in the sacrament of marriage" (48) and remains with them. In the incamation, he assumes human love, purifies it and brings it to fulfilment. By his Spirit, he gives spouse the capacity to live that love, permeating every part of their lives of faith, hope and charity. In this way, the spouse are consecrated and by means of a special grace build up the Body of Christ and form a domestic church (cf. Lumen Gentium, 11), so that the Church, in order fully to understand her mystery, looks to Christian family, which manifests her in a real way."
