From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

Over the course of my life, I have seen rainbows hundreds of times. And yet, every time, it still takes my breath away and makes me pause. "How beautiful and amazing," my heart cries out! Every time.



From my high school physics class, I know the mechanics of how it works—water droplets suspended in the air at a certain angle from the sunlight and...voila: instant rainbow. But knowing how they are made and why they show up at certain moments doesn't take away the beauty and wonder of it all. Rainbows do what they are supposed to do: make us pause and remember how wonderful our God is, and what a beautiful world God has created for us to live in. The Book of Genesis takes it one step further, seeing the rainbow as a reminder of God's covenant with us, that God will not allow the flood waters to overtake us, that God will bless and protect all who live on the earth.

It is fitting that we begin our Lenten journey this year with this colorful image etched in our hearts. Although we have much work left to do in confronting sin and death, righting wrongs, overcoming injustice, helping those in need...we begin not with an admonition, but a promise of God's enduring love and faithfulness. Maybe that is where we need to begin in our hearts as well. No matter what this Lenten journey will be for any one of us, no matter what inner conversion we need to embrace, no matter what penance we must perform, if we start with recognizing how much we are loved by the Lord, treasured by our God for simply who we are, then this becomes a time of joyfully turning our hearts to the Lord in an ever greater way.

When is the last time you saw a rainbow? What did the experience say to you about God? What response might we offer from it?

Helping Our Homeless

The Newburyport YWCA has conducted its annual census of the homeless in our community. And, while statistics are not yet available, it is expected there are close to 500 homeless people in our community and over half of them are children! In an effort to ease the suffering and as a Collaborative-wide Lenten observance, we again will be collecting "Homeless Care Packs" in all three churches. A Homeless Care Pack is a one-gallon Ziploc bag filled with personal care items for men and women. They will be distributed to local agencies serving our homeless, including our own Pelican Intervention Fund, St. Vincent de Paul, Pettengill House, Salvation Army, and Community Service, as well as distributed by our youth attending the annual 20-hour famine. Travel-size personal care items are the best size and can be found in most pharmacies in the area. There will be a collection box at the entrance of each church. Centering Prayer for Lent

Our Lenten reflection on Jesus' words and works reveals Jesus' intimate relationship with his Father. We see the depth of Jesus' faith, trust, and love for God. This relationship developed through prayer. Often we see Jesus withdraw from the crowds and even his apostles to pray alone in silence. Jesus tells us "When you pray, go into your private room, shut yourself in, and so pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you" (Matt 6:6). In Centering Prayer you enter your private room.

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn from the fully human Jesus how to pray by entering your secret room, spending time that places God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This is how we pray as we Center in silence.

Lenten Regulations

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. All **Fridays** during Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should take these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

Amoris Laetitia...Pope Francis

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Love and pregnancy In #169: A pregnant woman can participate in God's plan by dreaming of her child. "For nine months every mother and father dreams about their child... You can't have a family without dreams. Once a family loses the ability to dream, children do not grow, love does not grow, life shrivels up and dies." For Christian married couples, baptism necessarily appears as a part of that dream. With their prayers, parents prepare for baptism, entrusting their baby to Jesus even before he or she is born.
