

From the Parochial Vicar

Dear Friends.

It's "Laetare Sunday," the mid-point of the Lenten Season! "Laetare" is a Latin word that means, "Rejoice!" Yes, rejoice because Lent is half over and the coming feast of the Lord's



Resurrection, Easter, is in sight. Rejoice! The opening antiphon for today's Mass taken from the Prophet Isaiah (chapter 66) sets the tone:

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her.

Be joyful, all who were mourning:

Exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

And yes, in our collaborative, there are several reasons that give us occasion to rejoice! First, we rejoice with Father Tim as he celebrates his twenty-fifth anniversary of Ordination to the Priesthood. We rejoice with him and are grateful to God for his unselfish "yes" and for the twentyfive years of faithful service to the Church and to God's people in the Parish communities to which he has been assigned. As Parishioners of Holy Redeemer Parish and Immaculate Conception Parish, we rejoice with Father Tim, with his relatives, his friends, and parishioners of the other Parishes in which he has served. We welcome you and rejoice with you today in this special celebration.

As Easter draws near we rejoice with the men and women of our communities who have made the awesome decision to seek Baptism or full communion in the Catholic Church. Through study and prayer they have been in the process of preparing themselves for the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. So rejoice and keep them in your prayers: Lawrence Plumer, Kai Bolduc, Raymond Bardsley, Bonnie Bowes, Mary Sinaski, and Juan Valez. And let's come together as the Catholic Community of Merrimac, Newbury, Newburyport, and West Newbury to welcome our brothers and sisters into the Church at the Easter Vigil in a few weeks.

We rejoice, too, in the coming of the springtime! This past week was the official beginning of spring. It's been a long winter and as the snows, howling winds, and freezing temperatures of a couple of weeks ago seemed to have no let up. I was reminded of what my mother would say about this time of the year: "Je n'aime pas l'hiver!" No, I don't like winter either, but let's rejoice because the springtime is here.

There doesn't seem to be much rejoicing in the painting on the cover of this week's bulletin. Painted by Pieter Bruegel the Elder in 1559, it is titled "The Fight Between Carnival and Lent." With over two hundred very busy and active figures, the painting depicts life in the Netherlands at the time of the Reformation and the clash between Catholic and Protestant values. There is so much to notice in this painting, too much for this brief article. But notice that a jousting match is about to happen with the competitors each leading a procession, one from the Church the other from the Inn. Notice works of corporeal mercy and

depictions of the capital sins. See the well in the middle of the painting with a pig on one side and fish on the other. At the top center of the painting is a man who is sitting on the window sill of the upstairs floor of the house. Some art historians say that it is Pieter Bruegel. He included himself in the scene, surveying it all very carefully, not making a judgment. But what is he thinking? Is there anything he may want to tell us?

Perhaps his message would be to "Rejoice!"—something which seems to be missing on both sides of the "battle." He perhaps may want to tell us that the reason for the feasting or the reason for the fasting is to rejoice in the Lord and that our rejoicing should be contagious. When we have it, we want to give it to others. When others have it, we want to inherit it from them. So rejoice in the Lord, always!



Centering Prayer for Lent

Jesus tells us "When you pray, go into your private room, shut yourself in, and so pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you" (Matt 6:6). In Centering Prayer you enter your private room.

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn how to pray by entering your secret room, spending time that places God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This is how we pray as we Center in silence. Lent is the time to pray as Jesus taught us and enter into the Paschal Mystery, receiving new life in God through death to self.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. This daily practice deepens our faith as we come to better know our God as one who loves us unconditionally just as we are and trust God has plans to give us a future of hope.

Lenten Regulations

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. All **Fridays** during Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.


Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should take these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.
