



From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

Have you ever had a perfect day or a moment in time that you look back on as blissful, when all was right with the world? Maybe it wasn't exactly that way when you lived through it...a part of a day, and afternoon or the like. But



when we remember it, it is a place and time that we would always want to go back to and live there.

Many years ago, my family had a home on Cape Cod and gathered there frequently with extended family and friends. This was especially true in the summer when the Cape was at its best. Over the decades there were several families that we were close with, and they, too, had homes in the area or vacationed with us at the same time. There was one memorable day when we had gathered at our house for a late summer meal with our friends and some of their extended family. I recall this day in particular because my mother had found some crazy recipe from Yankee Magazine that purported to tell one how to cook a whole salmon in the dishwasher. As unlikely as that sounded, it actually worked! Wrap the prepared fish in cheesecloth with dill and lemon slices, put it on the top rack for a cycle and a half, and presto: perfectly poached salmon! Who knew?

But that wasn't what made that day so perfect. Looking back, it was because everybody was there. My parents and brother were home. Our close friends and their (now) adult children were in town. Other friends had come over for the feast. The crowning of the afternoon came when an absent son who was away on active duty with the Navy showed up unexpectedly on a 48-hour pass, having driven overnight from Virginia to be with us. The weather was perfect and now we were all together as family and friends. It was festive and joyful! As the years move on, I realize more and more that these kinds of gatherings are rarer than I'm sure that I ever appreciated at the time. Life events, changing jobs, moving, illness, and death do take their toll over the years.

I think back on this "perfect day" in my own life as I contemplate this weekend's Easter Gospel from Matthew. Not once, but twice, the women who came to the tomb are told to go to Galilee. This is where they first met Jesus, got to know Him and started following Him. Here, they witnessed His miracles and heard His sermons. It is the place where He walked on the water, calmed the storm, multiplied the loaves and fish, told them about the Beatitudes, and cast out many demons. It was here, among the sleepy fishing villages that surrounded its shores, that they fell in love with this man who would change their lives forever. If there was ever a time or place of comfort that they might look back to as being "perfect," it was at Galilee. For them, it was where their relationship with the Lord was most clear. It was, if you pardon the over-used phrase, a little bit of "Heaven on Earth."

It should be no surprise, then, that this was the place that Jesus would choose to gather His disciples after His resurrection. He wanted to reassure them that all would be

"Do not be afraid," He told them over and over. Jerusalem had been a contentious, hateful place for them. Misunderstanding, conflict, and division were lurking around every corner, it had seemed. Jealousy reared its ugly head when crowds of people had responded to Jesus' message and opened their hearts to the new signs that God was performing through Him. The established religious leaders of the time could take no more of it, so they plotted against Him. Ultimately, in an act of supreme betrayal, it was by the kiss of a friend that Jesus would fall into the hands of those who hated Him, those who would torture and kill Him. Yes, Jerusalem was a bitter city to be shunned for now. But Galilee! Now there was a place where their hearts would be lifted, their friendship with the Lord strengthened and where they could best learn to recognize the enduring presence of the Risen Lord.

One of the confounding aspects of the resurrection was that Christ appeared differently in His risen, glorified body than He did previously. In the other Gospel accounts, again and again, Jesus appears to His disciples and they don't recognize Him at first. Some think He is a gardener, others a stranger on the beach. Only when they see what He does or how He speaks, do they begin to connect the dots in their hearts and truly recognize the risen Lord in their midst. Nothing brought this home to them more clearly than when they "broke bread" as Jesus had taught them. In this simplest of gestures, they were connected to a thousand times before, where in Galilee, they had shared a meal with Him, laughed, and told stories. It was the perfect place to be strengthened and commissioned by the Lord for the new work of "baptizing all nations" and establishing the Church. Beginning in Galilee.

This Easter, I would invite you consider where your "Galilee" is. Where is that place or time, that moment in your life when you encountered God's love most clearly? What are the signs that it is still present, that this experience endures? How do you recognize that love of God in others? What do you most long for? Where do you find true and lasting peace in your life? What does it mean for you? How does this reality strengthen you to live your life today? How does it lead you forward, even in the midst of uncertainty? Where do you see the signs and hear the voice of the Risen Christ in your life?

If you are like me, the answer to these questions lie less in a specific place with four walls and roof over our heads than in the loving relationships that were and are nurtured within them. It is within these sacred bonds of the love of family and friends that we experience the joy of the Risen One and His eternal call to holiness and life. Here we are cherished. Here we are nurtured. Here we are forgiven. Here we are empowered. Here we are missioned and sent. Here...the reality of Heaven is closer than we might realize. There may or may not be salmon cooked in a dishwasher, but I'm pretty sure we will be well-fed and nourished for the road ahead.

May the joy of Easter surround you and your family this day!

All of these work together for all of the parishes of the collaborative. The collaborative has one Pastoral Council, and one Local Pastoral Plan for evangelization. The collaborative does not share money or bank accounts." (Learn more about Collaboratives at the DIM website, disciplesinmission.com.)

What is Disciples in Mission?

"Disciples in Mission calls every parish of the Archdiocese of Boston to become a strong, stable, intentional, and effective center of the New

Evangelization. *Disciples in Mission* is not a plan to close parishes. . . . In order better to focus our resources on evangelization, *Disciples in Mission* organizes the 288 parishes of the Archdiocese of Boston into approximately 135 Collaboratives." 
