From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

On the bulletin cover, you will see a rather dramatic image of the oculus window that is the sole source of natural light in the Church of St. Lazarus in the village of Bethany near Jerusalem in Israel. When in this church, it has the feel of being deep in a tomb. The



challenge is to listen for the voice of Christ, calling us to new life. This weekend's Gospel, though rich in symbolism and offering many layers of interpretation, has at its core, the

overwhelming reality that Jesus brought someone back from the dead. This was not the borderline case of someone who was ill and had slipped into a coma and was thought to be dead. Nor was it a story of their inexactness of ancient medicine where someone might have been close to death and was revived. Lazarus was dead. It had been four days. One ancient understanding of the boundary between life and death thought that the soul lingered for several days after the body appeared to be deceased (and in some cases the person returned to life if it wasn't their time). But here, the Gospel makes it completely clear that Lazarus had crossed any point of question in this regard. "Master, it has been four days, surely there will be a stench!" This only goes to underscore the supreme drama of Jesus' miracle and the deeply personal way that Jesus in His humanness and as God experienced this loss. It is a comfort to us to know that this is how the Lord looks at each of our losses as well. God takes it all personally! How intense His love for us and His attention to the smallest details of our lives. God's Promise in St. Paul's Letter to the Romans is His Promise to each of us: "...if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is alive because of righteousness...and the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you."

This may seem like an unlikely segue to a discussion of our Local Pastoral Plan, but to me the analogy is vivid. It's all about engaging the enduring presence of Christ's Spirit in each of us and in our Collaborative Parishes. The Plan is the framework for how we will focus our work over the next three years. But, it is the implementation of the Plan that will actually breathe new life into our personal faith and our Collaborative faith community.

This week, I was asked to submit the third draft of the Collaborative Pastoral Plan to the Archdiocese for review. This is the last opportunity for various offices in the Archdiocese to offer feedback before the final draft of our Local Pastoral Plan is submitted to Cardinal Sean O'Malley for approval on June 1st.

Throughout the first three months of this year, the Writing Team has been actively soliciting Parishioner feedback on this Plan. Facilitated discussions with staff, Parish Council and Parishioner Review Groups, the Second Collaborative

Centering Prayer for Lent

Jesus tells us "When you pray, go into your private room, shut yourself in, and so pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you" (Matt 6:6). In Centering Prayer you enter your private room.

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn how to pray by entering your secret room, spending time that places God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This is how we pray as we Center in silence. Lent is the time to pray as Jesus taught us and enter into the Paschal Mystery, receiving new life in God through death to self.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. This daily practice deepens our faith as we come to better know our God as one who loves us unconditionally just as we are and trust God has plans to give us a future of hope.

Lenten Regulations

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. All **Fridays** during Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should take these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Love in Marriage—In #89. All that has been said so far would be insufficient to express the Gospel of marriage and the family, were we not also to speak



of love. For we cannot encourage a path of fidelity and mutual self-giving without encouraging the growth, strengthening and deepening of conjugal and family love. Indeed, the grace of the sacrament of marriage is intended before all else "to perfect the couple's love".104 Here too we can say that, "even if I have faith so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I have, and if I deliver my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing" (1 Cor 13:2-3). The word "love," however, is commonly used and often misused.
