

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

Hot tubs in Heaven! That's what a little girl imagined eternal life being like. I received a great many, varied responses to my question during the homily last weekend: "What is Heaven like?" Some envisioned peace, justice,



and a lack of conflict. Others were sure the weather would be warmer than the frigid spring weather we have been enduring, "but not too warm!" one parishioner was quick to interject. Not like the "other place!" Some were sure there would be ample buffets of food—pizza and ice cream for sure. While others were more content to look forward to a place of love, happiness, and joy. One woman thought we would all be immersed in the music of Johan Sebastian Bach. Another gentleman, an avid golfer, I might add, was convinced there would be fairways forever. I'm not so sure on that last one.... I usually think of golf as more befitting of Dante's *Purgatorio* than his *Paradiso*, but that's just me. A nice, consistent string of eagles and birdies might just change my mind.

What was interesting in all of the responses taken together was that they painted a picture of a paradise as seen through human eyes—improvements, pleasures, and promises-fulfilled. Heaven does indeed look to satisfy our every human longing and desire. However, moving away from the "all-inclusive, cruise-ship non-stop vacation" image, our Scriptures invite us into what I think is an even more compelling eternity—one that begins in the here and now and blossoms into its fullness in the hereafter. 
