From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

Staying connected is such an obsession these days, isn't it? I can remember a time when I was compelled to drive a friend many miles out of our way while on vacation to the top of a high hill, just so he could get a



signal on his cell phone and make a call. It is not unusual to see people lifting their phones in the air or moving them around a room, just to gain a few bars of signal strength. Wifi, once rarefied and limited to the home or office, is now "de rigueur" and ubiquitous. As the now-famous television ad once proclaimed: "Can you hear me now?" Heck, there is even a signal here in church! No wonder it is hard to get through most liturgies today without a beep, chirp, ding or dong going off somewhere. As human beings, we are more connected to one another and "what's going on" in our world than ever before. It is a bit scary at times.

Long before the invention of microprocessors and the taming of the electromagnetic spectrum of radio waves, Jesus challenged the early disciples to remain connected to Him as their very source of life. "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." (Jn 15:5) Just as a branch off of a vine will wither and fade if it becomes separated from its source of water and nutrients through the vine, so will we as followers of the Lord dry up and perish without the life-giving spirit of Christ.

Don't try this at home, but if you were to take an average teenager and seal them in a room without Wifi or a broadband signal, you would soon see modern-day agony from the isolation and withering would take on new meaning! OK, a little melodramatic there, but you get the point: we human beings need connectivity today to thrive.

In reality, we always have. Although social media and the Internet are the latest expressions of our nature to stay connected, most of humanity, through most of history, has gone to great lengths to bridge the gaps between us and share our life together.

In the early Church, this was found in two significant ways: common prayer, which led to common action. The Eucharist was the source and summit of their prayer-life together. Jesus' command to eat and drink and "do this in memory of me" was found to bring them into such a close communion with the Risen Christ that it emboldened them for their common mission of spreading the Good News to a sometimes hostile or indifferent world. In this weekend's second reading, we hear these words: "Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us." (1 Jn. 3:24) The Christian life, then, is about praying together and from the fruit of that prayer being faithful in following God's commandments, especially that of loving one another. We are connected for a purpose!

Our connections are found in many different ways. We are bonded together by our relationships with one another. We are involved in communal works of mercy. How many of us, for example, this Lent put together care packs for the homeless or made sacrifices through a St. Vincent DePaul mite box? Maybe we help-out at the Tuesday evening meal or make sandwiches for the hungry every other Wednesday. Maybe we help prepare or serve a meal at Cor Unum in Lawrence. Perhaps our service has been focused internationally, maybe helping those in need through the IC Haiti project? Or maybe we have been involved more locally with addiction recovery efforts, like those who have supported the Pelican Fund. We are constantly called to support the missionary efforts of the Church. We give generously to the many charitable collections our parishes sponsor throughout the year. Doing so helps keep us connected to the larger body of believers and the wider mission of Christ. God wants everyone to experience the depth of His love for us in Christ. Sometimes God works precisely through our own personal holiness and faithfulness to His Word.

What is one way that I might better share that with someone else today? It is what staying connected is all about!
