From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This past weekend, we completed the last of our 8 scheduled First Communion celebrations within our Collaborative. Although it takes a great deal of effort to prepare for these moments, they are a



lot of fun to be part of. The joy and innocence that the young people bring forward is a true gift in and of itself. At each of the masses that I celebrated this past weekend, I asked the children what was the greatest gift they ever received. While I got some expected answers like "my hamster," "my PlayStation," "my bicycle," etc., I was very pleasantly surprised to hear many of them immediately refer to their family or their parents or siblings along with their faith and, of course, Jesus! I always tell people, children and adults alike, that if a priest ever asks you a question in church, you can always say, "Jesus," and it will be right. And so it was.

This weekend, we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, which originally was known as the "Feast of Weeks," which was a festival corresponding to the grain harvest. When we think about it from an agricultural perspective, the sending of the Holy Spirit is indeed about reaping a crop for The Lord. The Spirit was sent to remind us of everything Jesus taught us and to empower us to go do the same good works in the world that he did, and even more. How appropriate, then, that we celebrate this weekend the Sacrament of Confirmation at Immaculate Conception Church. Being strengthened to do the things of God is what our vocation as Christians is all about. Once they were given a share in the Holy Spirit, the Disciples were enabled to leave the locked doors of their fear behind and boldly go out into the world and share the Good News of the Christ's Resurrection.



We thank you for your patience and understanding for any disruptions and inconvenience this may have caused.


IC Concert and Raffle

Fr. Broderick's Scripture Study

Scripture Study Will Meet on May 15

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will meet on its regularly scheduled third Sunday of the month, May 15, 2016, in the IC Parish Center at 2:00pm. We will be reading and discussing from the Old Testament, The Book of Isaiah, Chapters 28-32. In Chapter 28, Isaiah stresses the importance of religious and political leaders by his criticism of them. Chapter 29 deals with prophecies related to punishment, hope, and deliverance. Chapters 30-32 deal with the kingdom of Judah and its people who place trust in temporal leaders rather than God.

The consensus among biblical scholars is that this book is the product of three or more authors. Most of the first 39 chapters belong to an author who goes by the name of Isaiah of Jerusalem who was writing in the eighth century B.C. at a very turbulent time in the history of the kingdoms of Israel and Judah.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.
