From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

On this great feast of Pentecost, it is appropriate that we spend a few moments contemplating the presence of the Holy Spirit in our midst. When we think of who we are as a Church and where we have been, we see



ample evidence of the Spirit. From the earliest of days, there was conflict and opposition to the spreading of the Gospel. To begin with, the synagogues rejected the notion of Christ as the long-awaited Messiah. Then the pagan rulers began to scapegoat and actively persecute the Church. Many Christians were martyred. When, in the course of history, the Roman Empire eventually became Christianized, the "normalization" of Christianity presented its own challenges to the faith, making it in some ways too easy to follow Christ without significant sacrifice. The Dark Ages and Medieval times plunged the Church into a period of relative ignorance where learning and the study of faith was restricted to only a few. Without strong central governments, the Church took on many secular responsibilities, not all of which lent themselves well to the task of evangelization. The Renaissance and the Enlightenment that would follow presented their own unique challenges to the Church's structure and the manner of sharing our faith. Spreading Christianity in the New World and across the seas also had its difficulties. World Wars, Nazism, Communism, and modern-day secularism all have brought many attacks on people of faith worldwide. In light of all of this, it would be a wonder that there is even a semblance of the Church Christ founded left! But maybe that is the point: without the enduring presence of the Holy Spirit, our Church would not-could not-still exist. It should have been destroyed many centuries ago by the ravages of human sin and hatred, by greed and corruption, ambition and lust. And yet, somehow, we are still here. Our Church is still a vibrant presence in the world, waxing and waning at various moments and in a kaleidoscope of places. In the Catholic Church alone, we are more than one billion strong. And yet we continue to profess one faith. How amazing is that?

This weekend we marvel at the many varied ways that God's Spirit pulsates through us as believers. For your consideration, I would like to name three ways I have experienced the Holy Spirit in my life and invite you to consider the ways that you have perhaps been touched by the Advocate. For me, these have been found in Speech, "Coincidences," and Stirrings.

First, Speech. One of the promises that Christ gave the disciples was that the Holy Spirit would give them the words they were to speak when it really mattered. This was critical, as many of them faced regular challenges by religious leaders and secular authorities that could be lifethreatening. Having just the right words would make all the

difference between furthering the cause of the Gospel or being crushed by those who opposed it. (See Luke 12:12 and 21:15). Words are powerful things, and when spoken at just the right time and place to just the right people or person, can alter the course of history. Imagine where we would be today without FDR's fireside chats during WWII, John F. Kennedy's choosing to go to the moon, or Martin Luther King's vision of "I Have a Dream"? It has been my experience that as disciples, the Holy Spirit will inspire us to say important and significant things at times and places where various individuals need to hear these words, and often in ways that we are unaware of their true impact. I can't tell you how many times people have approached me after mass with: "Father, what you said...," only to have no honest recollection of ever saying what had moved them so deeply. Either the words were so insignificant to me that I truly don't recall saying them, or people are hearing some other words from some One else. No matter how, it is humbling to see how the Holy Spirit will work through our

Next, "coincidences." I place this word in quotes, as I have to say that after more than 25 years of priestly ministry, I no longer believe there are real coincidences in this life. Too many times, against the most unlikely set of odds, I have had regular and significant encounters with people that have been life-altering and purposeful. It might mean stumbling upon someone who was walking around the corner of a building, or encountering an individual unexpectedly in the hospital or what might appear to be a chance encounter downtown. Yet in so many of these unplanned moments, just the right conversation happens that changes someone's life. My own life was altered in just this way by a simple conversation with a brother priest years ago that opened my heart to ponder a new assignment that I had not previously considered. My eventual "yes" to that assignment would involve 10 years of my life! How often do we write-off these "chance" moments and possibly miss what the Holy Spirit is trying to accomplish through us?

Finally, stirrings. Along with the often non-sensical "coincidences" of life, I believe the Holy Spirit works powerfully to stir our hearts to action and gently (mostly) prod us to be about God's business on a daily basis. My own vocation to the priesthood was born by a quiet stirring of my heart in the weeks following my Confirmation when I was still in High School, Later, as a priest, I recall one significant encounter with an inconsolable parishioner who was deeply upset about her grandson clinging to life in a distant hospital. In an experience that was without words, I heard the message in my heart: "go!" Without fully understanding everything that was going on, I got in my car and drove to that hospital to pray with his family and anoint him. Looking back years later, I think God worked richly through the events of that day. Do we make room for the Holy Spirit to nudge our souls and stir our attention towards what the Lord wants us to be about at different moments in our lives? Are we docile to these whispers and promptings?

Do we believe that God will speak to us through the Holy Spirit in this way?

Over the centuries, saints and sinners alike have encountered this Advocate that Jesus sent among us to further spread and build-up the Church and further the work of the Kingdom of God. Enough have said "yes" to these unplanned words, "coincidences" and stirrings that the Body of Christ thrives across our world today. Will we open ourselves to the new work the Holy Spirit presents to us today?

The Annual IC Celebration of Learning and Science Fair was held last week. All grades had displays of experiments and concepts learned that covered an array of science topics within biology, chemistry, and physics. Pre-K and Kindergarten depicted the life cycle of the

caterpillar in 3D, grade 1 tested the effects of sunlight and water on the growth of sunflowers, grade 2 constructed taller than life marble slope mazes, grade 3 grew colorful crystals from concentrated solutions, and grade 4 reported on a wide range of animals, with dioramas and written reports. Fifth grade studied the human body and presented their knowledge with life-size drawings. The Junior High students each conducted an experiment of their choice and presented their findings. Parents and grandparents learned a great deal from the wonderful posters, displays, and exhibitions that the students were on-hand to share. Hovercrafts, bicycles that purify water, energy drinks that impact the adolescent brain, the best popping popcorn, and optical illusions were just a few of the impressive topics that students studied. The Celebration of Learning and Science Fair is always impressive and a beloved event that we share as a community.
