

#### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we return to what is known as "Ordinary Time" or counted-time (as in ordinal) in the Church's liturgical calendar and cycle of seasons. The festivity that was our Easter Season is over, and the last burst of flamboyant red from



Pentecost has ended. In this big swath of weekends that extends throughout the summer and fall, we mostly try and unpack the preaching and teaching of Jesus from the perspective of each of the three Synoptic (or similar) Gospel writers: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Each have their own unique take on who Jesus is. Since the fourth Gospel, John, is so different from the other three, the Church places various passages from John throughout a selection of weekends and feasts in each year.

This weekend is one of those feasts. The Solemnity of the Blessed Trinity celebrates our enduring belief in One God who is Three Persons, which we encounter as Father, Son, and Spirit. John's language about the Trinity reflects a close and intimate inter-dwelling of these Three in presence, thought, and action. For John, Jesus is the perfect manifestation of the Father's love. We cannot know Jesus without knowing the Father. Today's passage from John further invites us into an experience of the singularity of mind and purpose that the Spirit presents of God's Will. The Spirit will speak the Truth (with a capital "T") that is from the Father and the Son. They are equal, yet distinct; unapproachable, yet intimately close to us; ultimately simple, yet inexhaustibly complex in their richness. Try and wrap your mind around that! If you struggle with it, just know that our greatest saints were left scratching their heads more often than not when contemplating God's Being. At the end of the day, God is mystery, and can never be explained away or completely understood. We are creatures, not The Creator, and humility before the Lord must always be our stance. St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the greatest religious thinkers of the last millennium, was reported to have said after publishing all of his theological works, that all of it was "straw" compared to the mystery of God. So much for systematic human thought!

But what gives us great hope in this weekend's Scriptures is the selection from the Book of Proverbs when the

creation of the world was described, "then was I beside him as his craftsman, and I was his delight day by day, playing before him all the while, playing on the surface of his earth; and I found delight in the human race." (PV 8:30-31) The playfulness of God's Spirit of Wisdom and the joy that God takes in our human race is evident and deeply encouraging. Sometimes we can get a little focused on the "Thou Shall's" and the "Thou Shall Not's" and forget that God actually wants to be in an intimate and lasting relationship with us, that we have been created in God's image, and that God actually likes us! This is good spiritual medicine for us when we are so often confronted with the effects of sin and death in our world. Despite our weakness and failings, Psalm 8 reassures us of our lofty place in God's plan for the world: "You have made him (mortal man) little less than the angels, and crowned him with glory and honor. You have given him rule over the works of your hands, putting all things under his feet.". We, of course, are challenged to live a life worthy of this great calling (thank you, St. Paul). But it is a hopeful one.

So, as an aged seminary professor once put it: "Four Gospels, Three Divine Persons, Two Natures of Christ, One God... and absolutely No Proof!" Now there's a call to faith if ever I heard it!



### IC Projects Update

Work has started on several long-awaited projects at Immaculate Conception Church including the completion of the heating and air conditioning system and major repairs to the two lower Church roofs and the Parish Center roof and Cupola. The next scheduled project will be the Rose Window repairs which we hope to begin in early summer. The reason for the delay is this restoration requires a highly skilled company and there are only a few glass studios that are available, which are in high demand. All this would not be possible without your generosity and private donations.

We thank you for your patience and understanding for any disruptions and inconvenience this may have caused.

### **IC-Haiti**

As our spring second collection approaches (May 28–29) we wanted to provide the Newburyport community with an update on our sister community in Haiti. Your generosity has been able to accomplish so much. At times of severe need in Haiti, it is wonderful to see that our directed efforts have been able to make a real difference in people's lives.

The old saying "It never rains but it pours" is never more true than in Haiti. While earlier in the year the drought challenged the food supply, now the rains have returned. While good for filling up cisterns and watering fields, the flooding has caused a cholera epidemic in the area-17 patients were treated at the hospital for cholera last week. (Cholera is spread through the lack of sanitation and water supply infrastructure.) The hospital has been proactive in trying to educate communities and distribute chlorine water treatment kits, and hope to contain the outbreak.

The area has seen over 50 cases of Zika so far, but they have been kept down to a steady average of 12-13 a month. The hospital continues to distribute DEET to vulnerable populations, monitor pregnancies, and work to educate the community about mosquito-borne illnesses in an effort to avoid a spike in the disease. After our last collection, IC-Haiti sent funding to pay for supplies and materials to assist with efforts to control the virus.

There is other good news, too. With the help of parishioners Stuart and Sam Meurer we were able to have an exchange of letters happen between the children at the Fr. Marc Piché school and the Immaculate Conception School. The hospital tells us that while the dental program that we funded has seen an increase in visits, fewer of them are for extractions. Over time, the program has been successful in allowing the doctors to save children's teeth and focus on prevention. Finally, we know that when the rains cause flooding in Puit Chacha, the school building and the tiny parish church next door provide enough space for the entire community to be able to shelter if they need to, which will prevent injuries and illnesses that occur as homemade shelters collapse.

We have had to support the community to deal with the crisis of the Zika outbreak: now we must catch up on our funding for the school. We can't let down the children who depend upon us for a daily meal and their best hope of success in life.

### Fr. Broderick's Scripture Study

#### Scripture Study Will Meet on June 5

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will meet on its Pope Francis recently released the Exhortation on the regularly scheduled first Sunday of the month, June 5, in the IC Parish Center at 2:00pm. We will be reading and discussing from the Old Testament, The Book of Isaiah, Chapter 28, Verse 23 through Chapter 32. Chapter 29 deals with prophecies related to punishment, hope, and deliverance. Chapters 30-32 deal with the kingdom of Judah and its people who place trust in temporal leaders rather than God.

The consensus among biblical scholars is that this book is the product of three or more authors. Most of the first thirtynine chapters belong to an author who goes by the name of Isaiah of Jerusalem who was writing in the eighth century B.C. at a very turbulent time in the history of the kingdoms of Israel and Judah.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

#### Amoris Laetita...Pope Francis

Family. In the weeks to come, you will be introduced to various statements from the Holy Father.

In #12, in speaking of marriage, Jesus refers us to yet

another page of Genesis, which, in its second chapter, paints a splendid and detailed portrait of the couple. First, we see the man, who anxiously seeks a "helper fit for him" (vv 18, 20), capable of alleviating the solitude which he feels amid the animals and the world around him. The original Hebrew suggests a direct encounter, face to face, eye to eye, in a kind of silent dialogue, for where love is concerned, silence is always more eloquent than words. It is an encounter with a face, a "thou," who reflects God's own love and is man's "best possession, a helper fit for him and pillar of support," in the words of the biblical sage (Sir 36: 24). Or again, as the woman of the Song of Solomon will sing in a magnificent profession of love and mutual self-bestowal: "My beloved is mine and I am his...I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine" (2: 16; 6:3).
