

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Last week, I was invited to join with other members of the Newburyport Clergy Association and participate in a vigil service for the Orlando shooting victims that was being hosted by Mayor Donna



Holaday in Market Square. About 300 people attended this gathering, including many parishioners that I saw from both of the parishes in our Collaborative. As part of the vigil, we read the names and ages of those who lost their lives in this senseless act of violence. It was profoundly sad to hear how young each of these victims were. The oldest was 50 years old. The youngest was only 18. As we were praying for these young men and women who died, as well as their families and community, it struck me how pervasive this plague of gun violence has become in our country, and that we can easily become numbed to the shock of it all. I struggled to remember some of the most recent tragedies: Newtown, CT; Virginia Tech; Aurora, CO; Fort Hood, TX; San Bernadino, CA; and of course, we all remember Columbine High School. But there were many others: too many to keep in mind, far too many to allow ourselves to forget. Even one death is too many.

But it also struck me that this problem is much bigger in scope than any election-year rhetoric will allow. I do not believe that this is something we can legislate our way out of. I know that politicians are under enormous pressure to "do something" to fix this. Certainly, common sense must prevail in these circumstances. But I do not think that we can "ban this" or "restrict that" as a way to solve this problem. We live in an open and free society, and as such, we will always be vulnerable in our freedom to these singular moments of madness. The alternative, of course, is to live in an increasingly totalitarian-state, hide in our homes and make any public areas more restrictive than prisons. Anyone who has flown on a commercial jet in recent years can see the beginnings of where this kind of mentality can take us. It is an illusion of security, at best. Those with an intent to kill will find a way.

True freedom, and the peace that is its fruit, comes not from laws and regulations, but from minds and hearts that are changed. I saw the seeds of this at the Vigil service as people from all walks of life came together to support not any political cause or agenda, but each other. We came together as members of a human community who were grieving, who were resolute in our confidence in the goodness of humanity and who valued and treasured each person who was present. It was a gathering to affirm life and our commitment to strengthen the bonds between one another. It is here that I think each of us can make a difference.

During the service, candles were distributed and lit. It was a breezy evening, and mine, along with many others', kept going out in the wind. Standing next to me was Rev. Chris Ney from Central Congregational Church and

Fr. Costin Popescu from the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church. Each of our candles went out at different moments, but working together and sharing the fragile and tiny flame between us, we were able to keep our candles going for the duration of the service. It was a simple lesson in what we Christians might call, *koinonia*, or community. It was a reminder that as individuals we will often falter and fall short, but together, in a right-relationship with one another and with God, we can endure and overcome all things. The evening also made it very clear that every one of us has a role to play in helping to bring this about. We can work to build these bridges, make these connections, overcome our lack of knowledge, listen more effectively, forgive more readily, and love more honestly.

Those who commit these unspeakable crimes are often so isolated from others and filled with such tremendous hatred. Imagine the difference that could be made if, as a community, we could win over even one individual who might otherwise go astray. Sound crazy, too "pie-in-the-sky"? Remember, it was how our Gospel was spread—one heart changed at a time. With God, I believe all things are possible. What can we do today?






IC Religious Education

Amoris Laetita...Pope Francis

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. In the weeks to come, you will be introduced to various statements from the Holy Father.

In #23—The Work of Your Hands: At the beginning of Ps 128, the father appears as a laborer who by the work of his hands sustains the physical well-being and tranquility of his family: "You shall eat the fruit of the labor of



your hands; you shall be happy, and it shall be well with you" (Ps 128: 2). It is clear from the very first pages of the Bible that work is an essential part of human dignity; there we read that "the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it" (Gen 2: 15). Man is presented as a laborer who works the earth, harnesses the forces of nature and produces "the bread of anxious toil" (Ps 127: 2), in addition to cultivating his own gifts and talents.


