From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,



It is difficult to underestimate the high drama portrayed in today's Gospel story about the widow of Nain. While there is great sadness in any funeral procession, this scene presents it many times over. Not only has this woman lost a son, but it was her only son. But to make matters even worse, in this time and place, in this culture, a woman needed an adult male figure in her life to give her stability and status. A husband was considered the most secure, followed by an adult son or another male relative. If she were young enough, it would be her father. But in a time in history where most men did not live beyond the age of 45, and her own husband had already passed, presumably this widow was alone in the world. That meant that her remaining days would be harsh ones, struggling to make a living, putting herself on the charity of others or maybe even begging in the street. For her, any last vestige of hope died with her son. Her village, too, was mourning this profound loss and bracing for the inevitable suffering to come.

That is, until Jesus happened along. Not only did he bring a young man back to life, as astounding as that is all by itself, but he also restored her dignity and lifted the grief of an entire village. In one gesture and one spoken sentence, Jesus completely transformed this darkest of days into one of rejoicing and awe. Yes, "God has visited his people!" (Lk 7:16) As a sign of the Kingdom of God, Jesus not only brings new life, but he heals a community that is shredded by grief and suffering. And he does it effortlessly. This gives us all great hope and reassurance that no matter how far off-track our lives may get, no matter what dark corner we may find ourselves backed into, no matter how bleak the future may look for ourselves or people we care about or our community or world. . . there is always a path of healing and complete restoration in Christ. He never does it partially, either. The vision of Christ's ministry is always

complete healing, on every level. The body is restored, the soul is healed, the community is made whole. It is the complete package.

Sometimes I take a moment and look up at the night sky and see the marvelous array of stars and galaxies that twinkle at us from unimaginable distances. Sometimes, too, I peer closely at the intricate patterns of color and design of the wings of a butterfly or take-in the dazzling beauty of a bed of wild flowers. In the vast and in the miniscule, there is an exponential amount of detail that has been superbly designed and masterfully executed. If God can put this much effort into crafting the world around us, how much more attention to detail will He give to those who have been made in His image? This Gospel allows us to sleep well at night knowing that no pain or suffering will go unheeded, no failure uncorrected, nothing that is lacking will go unfulfilled. We will not be forgotten or abandoned. We will rise to new life. *"He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, for the old order has passed away."* (Rv. 21:4) Where is the darkness in our lives today, and do we dare to hope in what God can do?
