



From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As a priest, I shake a lot of hands. Before and after weekend masses, on the street, in the supermarket, downtown, at a wake or graveside, in the hospital or visiting a nursing home. It's just what happens—a polite way to interact with all sorts of people in all kinds of circumstances—some happy, some sad. These encounters are always brief, but I am often struck by the wide variety of hands I touch. Some are soft and gentle, others hard and calloused. I try and meet each grasp with what I receive, neither crushing the fragile or offering a loose handshake to the firm. Sometimes, it is hopeless. One of our choir members, for example, has the iron grip of a machine press! I never come close to matching his strength. Many of the elderly, however, offer such a delicate grip that I am sometimes afraid to do anything more than lightly touch their palms, lest I risk snapping bones. So far, I don't think any of us have suffered because of it one way or another. Little children seem to prefer a "high five" over a confident handshake. But this human contact is a bit of an art-form, I guess. How do you shake someone's hand to communicate a warm greeting with compassion, gentleness, and love? I am conscious that these encounters may be the only human touch a person might have that day. How important it is to get it right!

Jesus was a master at the art of human touch. He knew exactly how to connect with people in such a way that God's great love was offered and exchanged. This weekend's Gospel shows us the great healing power of those he touched, and the incredible faith of those who touched him. In the end, all of the miracles of Jesus are always about something bigger than the individuals who are healed. How can our hearts not be moved by the woman who suffered for years with what we can only guess might be some form of cancer? That she finally found the complete healing and relief she had been seeking was only part of the story. Now she could be restored whole and entire to her rightful place in her family and village. Now she could once again contribute to the greater society around her, to have the dignity of her work, to have her life-giving relationships restored. Jesus' healing miracle was felt by many more beyond this courageous woman who humbly thought, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." (Mk 5:28)

The healing of Jairus' daughter demonstrates Jesus' absolute mastery over our human condition. No disease, no illness, no suffering, no physical or emotional or psychological impairment can stand before the grace of God in Christ. What we perceive as death and a cause for mourning, Jesus only views as the briefest moment of sleep. This extreme encounter engaging the most palpable of emotions in the most dramatic of ways is nonetheless a

call to faith on the part of everyone involved: Jairus and his family, their extended relatives and the whole village that was preparing to walk the most difficult of paths of grieving and loss. Given all that had occurred, could they make room for God's mastery even over life and death? Could the simple human touch of taking a little girl's hand and speaking the gentle words, "Talitha Koum," convey the great depth of God's passionate love for them all?

Not every touch we encounter leads to such heart-pounding drama. Not every illness is healed on our time scale. Not every near-death experience is so vividly turned around in the present moment. Frustratingly, we are stuck in this confounding in-between-time, where the promise of God's Kingdom is boldly offered, but not yet completely manifest. It can seem impossible to have any faith at all when we face the loss of those precious to us in this world. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews once said, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1) So, it will always be a call beyond what we can see and experience at any given moment, but not without plenty of present examples that give us good reason to trust in the One who has first loved us into existence.

Remember, even Jesus in His own humanness had His trust in God put to the test when on the Cross He recited the words of Psalm 22, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" (Ps 22:2) In the end, even Jesus had to trust in God's absolute faithfulness despite the utter loss and destruction that was caving in around Him. His hope and our model of faith must be a profound trust in God in all things, including the hope for life itself. Jesus touched people, so that they might have faith, that they might find hope in the darkest of moments...so that they could know they are truly loved in the most lasting of ways.

All this, through a simple touch.

The next time you have the opportunity to shake a hand or offer a genuine human embrace, ask yourself if you encounter the living presence of Christ in this singular gesture, and how you might best convey that saving love of God to others. While God can work through the most bombastic and incredible of events, the Scriptures tell us again and again of His preference for the simple and sublime. Like a handshake, or a gentle, holy touch.


Missionary Priest



Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Being Brothers and Sisters: In #195: Growing up with brothers and sisters makes for a beautiful experience of caring for and helping one another. For “fraternity in families

is especially radiant when we see the care, the patience, the affection that surround the little brother or sister who is frail, sick, or disabled.” It must be acknowledged that “having a brother or a sister who loves you is a profound, precious and unique experience.” Children do need to be patiently taught to treat one another as brothers and sisters. This training, at times quite demanding, is a true school of socialization. In some countries, where it has become quite common to have only one child, the experience of being a brother or sister is less and less common. When it has been possible to have only one child, ways have to be found to ensure that he or she does not grow up alone or isolated.
