From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

One of the most meaningful moments for me during our Pilgrimage to the Holy Land this past year was to spend some time reflecting and praying in Bethany. As you may be aware, Bethany



is a tiny little hamlet on the far side of the Mount of Olives. So, in a sense, it is a very near suburb of Jerusalem, only a short journey of an hour or two from the Holy City by foot. Its name, when translated, makes reference to the "house of the poor or afflicted," a humble locale, indeed. It was the place that Jesus often went to when he was in the vicinity of Jerusalem and the place where a few of his closest friends lived: Martha, her sister, Mary and their brother, Lazarus. They are mentioned more often than some of the Apostles in the Scriptures.

After climbing down into the treacherous depths of Lazarus' Tomb, which is nearby, we had the opportunity to celebrate Mass in the Church of Lazarus that is located next to it. Built in 1954 and designed by architect Antonio Barluzzi, it features one single source of light from an oculus above, both giving the feeling of being in a tomb as well as highlighting a number of the stories from the Gospels which are preserved in mosaic tiles on the walls. Visually, acoustically, and spiritually, it is a magnificent place to celebrate the Eucharist. There is a real richness in the simplicity of the space—it is a place where you can sit and be in the Lord's presence.

It is here, in this place of poverty, that Mary discovered a secret that has been treasured by countless disciples in the centuries that have followed: being in Jesus' presence, listening to His words, spending time in conversation (prayer?!) with Him is a gift that has value in and of itself. And while we are certainly called to be doing much serving in this world (let's make sure we don't forget the Gospel stories from the last few weeks), if we don't make time for being in Christ's presence, all of our other efforts may suffer, or be misguided, or be not as effective as they could otherwise be. Jesus is our source of life. Period. Mary recognized that. Martha, as good a hostess as she was, was still learning. Methinks Jesus probably appreciated Martha's efforts not after too long, however, when it came time for dinner. But the point here is that Mary was on to something.

I can remember a time, early in my seminary formation, when I was frustrated with all of the chapel exercises we were being required to attend: morning prayer, Mass, evening prayer, night prayer, etc... every day. I had never prayed so much in my entire life! After a few months of this

I was convinced that I could skip Mass for a year and still "have enough prayers in the bank" to last me for many more to come. I recall sharing with my spiritual director at the time, a man who had a robust background in social justice and pastoral work, that I wanted to go out and do rather than to sit and pray. I wanted to feed the homeless, work with those in need, visit the sick...you know, do "real" ministry. Enough of all this prayer stuff! His response, wisely, was of course, to go and spend even more time in prayer. He never told me not to do those other things. In time, I would have my fill of them all. But prayer had to come first. If I didn't make the time to get to know Jesus, I would never be able to be an effective disciple, and would never make a good priest. So, prayer it was.

But I also remember the joy, found in those same days, of when my prayer would come alive, when the words of the Scripture passage I was pondering would be jumping off of the page as they resonated with different movements of my heart and what was going on in my life. Prayer, as I would discover, could be deeply satisfying in ways I never dreamed of. And from that prayer, I would find strength and motivation and energy and courage to go and do the many acts of service that the Gospels enjoin upon us. They are intimately connected and both are essential to living as a disciple of Jesus Christ, but prayer has to be first.

In a recent issue of *America* magazine, John Martens shares this insight when reflecting on Mary's insistence on sitting at Jesus' feet: "We are not doing for, we are being with. It is the heart of the one necessary thing: being present to Jesus in order to love others." Outside of the Church of Lazarus, there is a plaque inscribed in English and German that reads:

Today, as in the past, the Love of Jesus seeks a refuge, where He is lovingly expected and where He can rest. He finds our hearts are filled with distractions —people, work, our own interests— He longs for us to empty our hearts and lovingly receive Him.

May we embrace this gift of His presence today and share it richly with those in the world that surrounds us. If we are good "sitters" we will be better "doers."

Moments of Mercy

From: United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (usccb.org) What does mercy look like through the eyes of another person? We know how we would like people to act with mercy toward us, but what is mercy to a family member, our coworker, or the person we walk by every day? For each of us, there are particular things that are meaningful to us and speak to our need for mercy. In spite of these differences, we are still able to minister to one another, because the love of God surpasses our differences and draws us all into the one Body of Christ. In order to show others the love of God through acts of mercy and compassion, we need to be attentive to their needs and the way in which God is working in their lives.

1. Volunteer some of your time this month at a place where you will meet a variety of people-for instance, a local community center, a food bank, or a homeless shelter. Though everyone might have different needs, all are searching for the love and mercy of God. Reflect on the way your need for God's love is similar to their need for God's love.

2. Spend some time talking with a younger or older relative or friend. Sometimes we ignore those whose perspective on life is different or far removed from ours (being much younger or much older than us). Listen to what is important to them, recognizing God's love acting in their life and the way in which you can best act with mercy and compassion toward them.

Note Change in Schedule

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will **not** meet on its regularly scheduled third Sunday in July, but will meet on the fourth Sunday, July 24, 2016, in the IC Parish Center at 2:00pm. We will conclude reading and discussing the first section of *The Book of Isaiah*: The Book of Judgment, Chapters 36 through 39 and begin the second section, The Book of Consolation, which is sometimes called the Deutero-Isaiah, Chapters 40 through 42. The second section is generally attributed to an anonymous poet who prophesied toward the end of the Babylonian exile and contains the great messianic oracles known as the Suffering Servant songs. This would be an ideal time for interested collaborative members to join the group as we begin study on a different period in Israel's history.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

Pope Francis: Year of Mercy

Mercy is the very foundation of the Church's life. All of her pastoral activity should be caught up in the tenderness she makes present to believers; nothing in her preaching and in her witness to the world can be lacking in mercy. The



Church's very credibility is seen in how she shows merciful and compassionate love. The Church 'has an endless desire to show mercy.' Perhaps we have long since forgotten how to show and live the way of mercy. The temptation, on the one hand, to focus exclusively on justice made us forget that this is only the first, albeit necessary and indispensable step. But the

Church needs to go beyond and strive for a higher and more important goal. On the other hand, sad to say, we must admit that the practice of mercy is waning in the wider culture. In some cases the word seems to have dropped out of use. However, without a witness to mercy, life becomes fruitless and sterile, as if sequestered in a barren desert. The time has come for the Church to take up the joyful call to mercy once more. It is time to return to the basics and to bear the weaknesses and struggles of our brothers and sisters. Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope.


